This legislation re-creates the Family Courts Trust Fund without modification, effective upon becoming a law. The Family Courts Trust Fund, FLAIR #22-2-973, is administered by the State Courts System. This fund was created by Chapter 98-378/382.

**II. Present Situation:**

The trust fund is used to provide for the general administration of the family courts divisions, including guardian ad litem programs, mediation programs, legal support, training, automation, and other related costs incurred in relation to family law cases.
