This legislation re-creates the Criminal Justice Standards and Training Trust Fund without modification, effective upon becoming a law. The Criminal Justice Standards and Training Trust Fund, FLAIR #71-2-148, is administered by the Department of Law Enforcement. This fund was created by Chapter 98-362.

#### II. Present Situation:

The Criminal Justice Training Trust Fund was created to provide for Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission approved criminal justice advanced and specialized training and criminal justice training school enhancements. The trust fund also supports the Department of Law Enforcement, Division of Criminal Justice Standards and Training which supports and assists the Commission in the execution, administration, implementation, and evaluation of the Commission's activities.

This bill re-creates the trust fund without modification.
