I. Summary:

This legislation re-creates the Florida International Trade and Promotion Trust Fund without modification, effective upon becoming a law. The Florida International Trade and Promotion Trust Fund, FLAIR #31-2-338, is administered by the Executive Office of the Governor. This fund was created by Chapter 99-20.

II. Present Situation:

Section 288.826, F.S., establishes the Florida International Trade and Promotion Trust Fund to be administered by the Office of Tourism, Trade, and Economic Development for the operation of Enterprise Florida, Inc., and its boards and for the operation of Florida foreign offices authorized under s. 288.012, F.S.

The Florida International Trade and Promotion Trust Fund receives 4.25 percent of the proceeds of the \$2.00 per day rental car surcharge authorized under s. 212.0606, F.S.

This bill re-creates the trust fund without modification.
