This legislation re-creates the Planning and Budgeting System Trust Fund without modification, effective upon becoming a law. The Planning and Budgeting System Trust Fund, FLAIR #31-2-535, is administered by the Executive Office of the Governor. This fund was created by Chapter 99-19.

II. Present Situation:

The Planning and Budgeting System Trust Fund is used to fund activities related to the development, enhancement and support of the Legislative Appropriations System / Panning and Budgeting Subsystem (LAS/PBS) as authorized under s. 216.141, F.S.

The Legislature contracts with the Executive Office of the Governor to develop the planning and budgeting system and to provide services to the Legislature for the support and use of the legislative appropriations system.
