### I. Summary:

This legislation re-creates the Transportation Disadvantaged Trust Fund without modification, effective upon becoming a law. The Transportation Disadvantaged Trust Fund, FLAIR #55-2-731, is administered by the Department of Transportation. This fund was created by Chapter 98-233, Laws of Florida.

### II. Present Situation:

The Transportation Disadvantaged Trust Fund was created to fund the operation and responsibilities of the Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged. Funds deposited in the trust fund may be used by the commission to subsidize a portion of a transportation disadvantaged person's transportation costs.

This bill re-creates the trust fund without modification.
