## House Memorial

A memorial to the President and Congress of the United States, urging the President and Congress to direct the Secretary of Veterans Affairs to establish a national cemetery in Duval County, Florida, to serve the needs of veterans and their families in northeast Florida and southeast Georgia.

WHEREAS, veteran deaths are increasing each year, especially as World War II and Korean War era veterans continue to advance in age, resulting in a corresponding increase in the demand of burial services in national cemeteries, and

WHEREAS, based on national census data, annual veteran deaths are not expected to peak until the year 2008 before beginning a possible decline; during the next decade, annual deaths are expected to increase 10.5 percent from a total of 561,000 in 1999 to 620,000 in 2008, notwithstanding any future national emergencies, and

WHEREAS, according to the Florida Department of Veterans' Affairs, one out of every ten veteran deaths nationally is a resident of Florida at time of interment, and

WHEREAS, Florida has the second largest population of veterans, totaling 1.7 million, with more than 6,500 veterans and family members being laid to rest at Bushnell and Bay Pines national cemeteries in the year 2000, and

WHEREAS, Florida has two smaller national cemeteries at Pensacola and St. Augustine; Pensacola is nearing capacity and St. Augustine is already closed, and

1 WHEREAS, South Florida was recently awarded a national cemetery following nearly 14 years of being identified as a geographic area in which the need for burial space for veterans was greatest, and

WHEREAS, Governor Jeb Bush praised the efforts of the Florida Department of Veterans' Affairs in helping secure federal funding and raising the awareness of the need for a national cemetery in South Florida, and

WHEREAS, the National Cemetery Administration considers the burial needs of veterans to be met for those veterans that have reasonable access to a burial option, meaning that a first interment option in a national or state veterans' cemetery is available within 75 miles of the veteran's place of residence, and

WHEREAS, the nearest open national cemeteries serving northeast Florida and southeast Georgia veterans are located in Bushnell, Florida, a distance of 150 miles, and Marietta, Georgia, a distance of 365 miles, and

WHEREAS, according to the National Cemetery Administration, the development of new national cemeteries generally takes five to seven years for establishment, and

WHEREAS, according to the Florida Department of Veterans' Affairs, there are more than 325,000 veterans from Florida and Georgia living within 75 miles of Duval County, and

WHEREAS, the Jacksonville City Council recently adopted a resolution in support of building a new national cemetery in Duval County and urging federal legislation to accomplish this goal, NOW, THEREFORE,

31 Be It Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

That the President and Congress of the United States be urged to direct the Secretary of Veterans Affairs to establish a national cemetery in Duval County, Florida, to serve the needs of veterans and their families in northeast Florida and southeast Georgia.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be transmitted to the President of the United States, the President of the United States Senate, the Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, and to each member of the Florida delegation to the United States Congress.
