Subsection (3) of section 495.071, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 11 495.071 Duration and renewal.--12 (3) The Department of State shall notify registrants 13 of marks hereunder of the necessity of renewal within the year 14 next preceding the expiration of the 10 years following from 15 the date of registration by mailing a renewal notice by 16 17 certified mail, return receipt requested, to the registrant's current address on file with the department. The current 18 19 address for a business organization is the address on the most 20 recent annual report required by s. 607.1622, s. 608.4511, or 21 s. 620.177 writing to the last known address of the 22 registrants. The department shall prescribe the forms on which to make the required notification and the renewal called for 23 in subsection (1) and may substitute the uniform business 24 25 report, pursuant to s. 606.06, as a means of satisfying the 26 requirement of this part. 27 Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2003. 28 29 30 31 1

Requires the Department of State to notify registrants by certified mail the next year preceding the expiration of 10 years after the date of registration of a trademark or service mark.

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
