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14-694-03 A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission; amending s. 370.021, F.S.; providing additional penalties for the unlicensed sale or purchase of a saltwater product or the harvest or attempted harvest with intent to sell of a saltwater product; provides for civil penalties, imprisonment, permanent revocation of license privileges, and forfeiture of property involved in the offense; amending s. 327.30, F.S.; increasing the threshold amount at which a boating accident resulting in property damage only must be reported to the Division of Law Enforcement of the commission and certain other law enforcement agencies; amending s. 327.43, F.S.; deleting certain restrictions and penalties for anchoring or mooring a vessel within Silver Glen Run and Silver Glen Springs; repealing ss. 370.15(6) and 370.153(3)(c), F.S., relating to live bait shrimping; amending ss. 370.1535 and 370.154, F.S., relating to the regulation of shrimp fishing; conforming provisions to

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          (6) PENALTIES FOR UNLICENSED SALE, PURCHASE, OR
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    HARVEST.--It is a major violation and punishable as provided
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    in this section for an unlicensed person who is required to be
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    licensed under this chapter to sell or purchase any saltwater
    product or to harvest or attempt to harvest any saltwater
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    product with intent to sell the saltwater product.
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          (a) In addition to being subject to other penalties
   provided in this chapter, upon a second or subsequent
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    violation, any person who sells or purchases any saltwater
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    product without having purchased the licenses required by this
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    chapter for such sale is subject to additional penalties as
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    follows:
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           1. A second violation is a misdemeanor of the first
    degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083,
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    and such person may also be assessed a civil penalty of up to
   $2,500 and is subject to a suspension of all license
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    privileges under chapters 370 and 372 for a period not
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    exceeding 90 days.
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           2. A third violation is a misdemeanor of the first
    degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083,
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    with a mandatory minimum term of imprisonment of 6 months, and
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    such person may also be assessed a civil penalty of up to
   $5,000 and is subject to a suspension of all license
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   privileges under chapters 370 and 372 for a period not
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    exceeding 6 months.
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           3. A third violation within 1 year after a second
31 violation is a felony of the third degree, punishable as
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1 provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083, with a mandatory minimum term of imprisonment of 1 year, and such person shall be 2 3 assessed a civil penalty of \$5,000 and all license privileges under chapters 370 and 372 shall be permanently revoked. 4 5 4. A fourth violation is a felony of the third degree, б punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083, with a 7 mandatory minimum term of imprisonment of 1 year, and such 8 person shall be assessed a civil penalty of \$5,000 and all 9 license privileges under chapters 370 and 372 shall be 10 permanently revoked. 11 (b) In addition to being subject to other penalties provided in this chapter, any person whose license privileges 12 under chapters 370 and 372 have been permanently revoked and 13 who thereafter sells or purchases or who attempts to sell or 14 purchase any saltwater product commits a felony of the third 15 degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083, 16 17 with a mandatory minimum term of imprisonment of 1 year, and 18 such person shall also be assessed a civil penalty of \$5,000. 19 All property involved in such offense shall be forfeited pursuant to s. 370.061. 20 21 (c) In addition to being subject to other penalties 22 provided in this chapter, any person whose license privileges under chapter 370 are under suspension and who during such 23 period of suspension sells or purchases or attempts to sell or 24 purchase any saltwater product shall be assessed the following 25 26 additional penalties: 27 1. A first violation is a misdemeanor of the second degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083, 28 29 and such person may be assessed a civil penalty of up to 30 \$2,500 and is subject to a suspension of all license 31

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1 privileges under chapters 370 and 372 for a period not 2 exceeding 90 days. 3 2. A second violation occurring within 12 months after a first violation is a felony of the third degree, punishable 4 5 as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083, with a mandatory б minimum term of imprisonment of 1 year, and such person may be 7 assessed a civil penalty of up to \$5,000 and is subject to a 8 suspension of all license privileges under chapters 370 and 9 372 for a period not exceeding 6 months. All property involved 10 in such offense shall be forfeited pursuant to s. 370.061. 11 3. A third or subsequent violation occurring within 2 years after a second violation is a felony of the third 12 degree, with a mandatory minimum term of imprisonment of 1 13 year, and such person shall be assessed a mandatory civil 14 penalty of up to \$5,000 and all license privileges under 15 chapters 370 and 372 shall be suspended for a period not 16 17 exceeding 24 months. All property involved in such offense shall be forfeited pursuant to s. 370.061. 18 19 (d) In addition to being subject to other penalties provided in this chapter, upon a second or subsequent 20 21 violation, any person who harvests or attempts to harvest any saltwater product with intent to sell the saltwater product 22 without having purchased a saltwater products license with the 23 24 requisite endorsements is subject to additional penalties as 25 follows: 26 1. A second violation is a misdemeanor of the first 27 degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083, and such person may also be assessed a civil penalty of up to 28 29 \$2,500 and is subject to a suspension of all license 30 privileges under chapters 370 and 372 for a period not 31 exceeding 90 days.

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2. A third violation is a misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083, with a mandatory minimum term of imprisonment of 6 months, and such person may also be assessed a civil penalty of up to \$5,000 and is subject to a suspension of all license privileges under chapters 370 and 372 for a period not

7 exceeding 6 months. 8 3. A third violation within 1 year after a second violation is a felony of the third degree, punishable as 9 10 provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083, with a mandatory minimum 11 term of imprisonment of 1 year, and such person shall also be assessed a civil penalty of \$5,000 and all license privileges 12 under chapters 370 and 372 shall be permanently revoked. 13 14 4. A fourth violation is a felony of the third degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083, with a 15 mandatory minimum term of imprisonment of 1 year, and such 16 17 person shall also be assessed a mandatory civil penalty of \$5,000 and all license privileges under chapters 370 and 372 18 19 shall be permanently revoked. 20 21 For purposes of this subsection, a violation means any judicial disposition other than acquittal or dismissal. 22 23 Section 2. Subsection (2) of section 327.30, Florida 24 Statutes, is amended to read: 327.30 Collisions, accidents, and casualties.--25

(2) In the case of collision, accident, or other
casualty involving a vessel in or upon or entering into or
exiting from the water, including capsizing, collision with
another vessel or object, sinking, personal injury requiring
medical treatment beyond immediate first aid, death,

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1 which indicate the possibility of death or injury, or damage 2 to any vessel or other property in an apparent aggregate 3 amount of at least\$2,000 $\frac{500}{500}$ , the operator shall without delay, by the quickest means available give notice of the 4 5 accident to one of the following agencies: the Division of Law 6 Enforcement of the Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission; 7 the sheriff of the county within which the accident occurred; or the police chief of the municipality within which the 8 accident occurred, if applicable. 9 10 Section 3. Section 327.43, Florida Statutes, is 11 amended to read: 327.43 Silver Glen Run and Silver Glen Springs; 12 13 navigation channel; anchorage buoys; violations.--(1) The Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission is 14 hereby directed to mark a navigation channel within Silver 15 Glen Run and Silver Glen Springs, located on the western shore 16 17 of Lake George on the St. Johns River. (2) The commission is further directed to establish 18 permanent anchorage buoys within Silver Glen Run and Silver 19 20 Glen Springs. (3) Vessel anchorage or mooring shall only be allowed 21 22 utilizing permanently established anchorage buoys. No vessel shall anchor or otherwise attach, temporarily or permanently, 23 24 to the bottom within Silver Glen Run or Silver Glen Springs. (4) Any violation of this act shall constitute a 25 violation of the boating laws of this state and shall be 26 27 punishable by issuance of a uniform boating citation as 28 provided in s. 327.74. Any person who refuses to post a bond 29 or accept and sign a uniform boating citation, as provided in s. 327.73(3), commits a misdemeanor of the second degree, 30 31 punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083.

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2	SENATE SUMMARY
3	Provides that the unlicensed sale or purchase of a
4	saltwater product or the unlicensed harvest or attempted harvest with intent to sell of a saltwater product is a
5	major violation of chapter 370, F.S., and imposes additional penalties for any such violation, including
6	civil penalties, imprisonment, permanent revocation of license privileges, and forfeiture of the property involved in the offense. Ingresses from \$500 to \$2,000
7	involved in the offense. Increases from \$500 to \$2,000 the threshold amount at which a boating accident regulting in property damage only must be reported to the
8	resulting in property damage only must be reported to the Division of Law Enforcement of the Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission and local law enforcement
9	agencies. Removes the restrictions and penalties for anchoring or mooring a vessel within Silver Glen Run and
10	Silver Glen Springs. Deletes certain obsolete references to live bait shrimping. (See bill for details.)
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
