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          (a) The benefit is determined to be covered under the
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    terms of the policy;
          (b) The claim is limited to treatment of mental health
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    or substance abuse, including drug and alcohol abuse; and
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          (c) The insured authorizes the insurer, in writing, as
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   part of the claim to make direct payment of benefits to a
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    recognized hospital, physician, or other licensed provider,

This act shall take effect July 1, 2003. б SENATE SUMMARY Provides that health insurance benefits for mental health or substance abuse treatment shall be paid directly to the hospital, physician, or other provider when requested by the insured, even if direct payment is contrary to the insurance contract.

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
