14	(2) EXEMPT POSITIONSThe exempt positions that are not
15	covered by this part include the following:
16	(d) All officers and employees of the state universities
17	and the Correctional Education Program within the Department of
18	Corrections, and the academic personnel and academic
19	administrative personnel of the Florida School for the Deaf and
20	the Blind. In accordance with the provisions of s. 1002.36, the
21	salaries for academic personnel and academic administrative
22	personnel of the Florida School for the Deaf and the Blind shall
23	be set by the board of trustees for the school, subject only to
24	the approval of the State Board of Education. The salaries for
25	all instructional personnel and all administrative and
26	noninstructional personnel of the Correctional Education Program
27	shall be set by the Department of Corrections, subject to the
28	approval of the Department of Management Services.

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(m) All assistant division director, deputy division director, and bureau chief positions in any department, and those positions determined by the department to have managerial responsibilities comparable to such positions, which positions include, but are not limited to:-,

 of Corrections that are assigned primary duties of serving as
 the superintendent or assistant superintendent <u>of an</u>
