Disqualifications. --20 (a) No person convicted of a felony, or adjudicated in 21 this or any other state to be mentally incompetent, shall be 22 qualified to vote or hold office until he or she has been released from incarceration and any postconviction supervision 23 restoration of civil rights or removal of disability. No 24 25 person adjudicated in this or any other state to be mentally incompetent shall be qualified to vote or hold office until 26 27 removal of disability. 28 (b) No person may appear on the ballot for re-election to any of the following offices: 29 30 (1) Florida representative,
