A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Florida Institute for Human and Machine Cognition; creating s. 1004.447, F.S.; establishing the Florida Institute for Human and Machine Cognition at the University of West Florida; requiring the State Board of Education to enter into an agreement with a not-for-profit corporation for the governance and operation of the institute; providing that the corporation shall act as an instrumentality of the state; authorizing the creation of subsidiaries by the corporation; providing powers of the corporation; providing for a board of directors; providing for an annual postaudit report; authorizing the board of directors to secure liability protection; providing for assumption of responsibilities of the corporation by the University of West Florida under certain circumstances; providing for administration of the institute by a chief executive officer and providing duties; requiring appointment of a council of scientific advisers and providing duties; providing that the corporation and its subsidiaries are not agencies for certain purposes; authorizing contracts without competitive bidding; providing that the institute is a corporation acting as an instrumentality of the state for purposes of sovereign immunity; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 2 3 Section 1. Section 1004.447, Florida Statutes, is created to read: 4 5 1004.447 Florida Institute for Human and Machine 6 Cognition. --7 (1)(a) The Florida Institute for Human and Machine 8 Cognition is established at the University of West Florida as a Florida not-for-profit corporation organized under the 9 10 provisions of chapter 617. 11 (b) The corporation is authorized to create not-for-profit corporate subsidiaries that are organized under 12 the provisions of chapter 617 upon the prior approval of the 13 State Board of Education, to fulfill its mission. 14 15 (c) The corporation and any authorized and approved 16 subsidiary: 17 1. Shall be a corporation primarily acting as an instrumentality of the state, pursuant to s. 768.28(2), for 18 19 purposes of sovereign immunity. 20 2. Is not an agency within the meaning of s. 30.03(11). 21 22 3. Is subject to the open records and meeting requirements of s. 24, Art. I of the State Constitution, 23 chapter 119, and s. 286.011. 24 25 4. May receive, hold, invest, and administer property and any moneys acquired from private, local, state, and 26 27 federal sources, as well as technical and professional income generated or derived from practice activities of the 28 29 institute, for the benefit of the institute and the 30 fulfillment of its mission.

- 5. May perform all things necessary to secure letters of patent, copyrights, and trademarks on any work products and to enforce its rights therein.
- <u>6. May secure comprehensive general liability</u> protection, including professional liability protection, for the not-for-profit corporation and its subsidiaries.
- 7. May enter into affiliation agreements with other universities or research institutes.
- (d) The officers, directors, and employees of the corporation or any authorized subsidiary shall be governed by the code of ethics for public officers and employees as set forth in part III of chapter 112.
- (e) The articles of incorporation of the corporation, or any authorized and approved subsidiary, shall include that:
- 1. The corporation shall provide equal employment opportunities for all persons regardless of race, color, religion, gender, national origin, age, handicap, or marital status;
- 2. The corporation is subject to the open records and meeting requirements of s. 24, Art. I of the State Constitution.
- 3. All officers, directors, and employees of the corporation shall be governed by the code of ethics for public officers and employees as set forth in part III of chapter 112.
- 4. The board members are responsible for the prudent use of all public and private funds and that they will ensure that the use of funds is in accordance with all applicable laws, bylaws, or contractual requirements.
- 5. The fiscal year of the corporation and any authorized subsidiary is from July 1 to June 30.

1	(2)(a) The affairs of the corporation shall be managed
2	by a board of directors who shall serve without compensation.
3	(b) The board of directors shall consist of:
4	1. The chair of the State Board of Education or his or
5	her designee;
6	2. The chair of the University of West Florida Board
7	of Trustees or his or her designee;
8	3. The President of the University of West Florida or

LO	4. Three state university representatives, one of whom

(4) Any director may be reappointed.

- (5) The chair of the board of directors shall be selected by a majority vote of the directors, a quorum being present.
- (6) The State Board of Education shall enter into an agreement with the corporation that provides for:
- (a) Approval by the State Board of Education of the articles of incorporation of the corporation.
- (b) Approval by the State Board of Education by July 1, 2003, of the articles of incorporation of any not-for-profit corporate subsidiary created by the corporation.
- (7) The corporation shall, by August 1, 2003, enter into an affiliation agreement with the University of West Florida Board of Trustees for:
- (a) The use of or mutual provision or participation in university programs or services, including use of the university's moneys, facilities, furnishings, equipment, other chattels, personnel, or services.
- (b) Utilization of facilities and personnel for mutually approved teaching and research programs conducted by universities or research institutes.
- (c) Preparation of an annual postaudit of the corporation's financial accounts and the financial accounts of any subsidiaries to be conducted by an independent certified public accountant. The annual audit report shall include management letters and be submitted to the Auditor General and the State Board of Education for review.
- (d) Use of the facilities of the University of West Florida, including all furnishings, equipment, and other chattels used in the operation of those facilities, which shall govern and operate the Florida Institute for Human and

Machine Cognition in accordance with the terms of the agreement between the State Board of Education and the not-for-profit corporation.

- (e) If the agreement between the corporation and the State Board of Education is terminated, all property, including buildings, land, furnishings, equipment and other chattels originally leased to the corporation, as well as any subsequently constructed or otherwise acquired facilities in connection with the operation of the institute, automatically reverts to full ownership by the University of West Florida. Such a reversionary interest of the state in all after-acquired facilities of the corporation is in furtherance of the goals of this legislation and such a present ownership interest by the university is a continuing and insurable public interest.
- (8) The corporation shall employ a chief executive officer to administer the affairs of the Florida Institute for Human and Machine Cognition. The chief executive officer shall be appointed by and serve at the pleasure of the board of directors. The chief executive officer shall exercise the following powers and duties, subject to the approval of the board of directors:
- (a) Establish programs that fulfill the mission of the institute, as one of the nation's premier information-technology-related research organizations, in research, education, scientific advancement, and economic development. However, the chief executive officer may not establish academic programs for which academic credit is awarded, or programs that culminate in the conferring of a degree, without prior approval of the University of West Florida.

- (b) Control the budget and the moneys appropriated or donated to the institute from private, local, state, and federal sources, as well as technical and professional income generated or derived from research activities of the institute. However, income generated by university faculty from research activities at the institute shall be shared between the institute and the university, as determined by the chief executive officer and the appropriate university president or the president's designee.
- (c) Appoint representatives of the institute to carry out the research and educational activities of the institute and establish the compensation, benefits, and terms of service of such representatives. Representatives may hold concurrent appointments at affiliated academic institutions. University faculty may hold concurrent appointments at the institute.
- (d) Control the use and assignment of space and equipment within the facilities.
- (e) Create the administrative structure necessary to carry out the mission of the institute.
- (f) Annually report in writing to the Commissioner of Education on the activities of the institute and state budget allocation expenditures.
- (g) Provide a copy of the institute's annual report to the Governor, the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the chair of the State Board of Education, and the University of West Florida.
- (h) Appoint a council of scientific advisers to the chief executive officer comprised of leading researchers and scientists who shall review programs and recommend research priorities and initiatives to maximize the state's investment in the institute.

Τ	1. The board of directors shall ratify the
2	appointments of scientific advisers to the council.
3	2. Each member of the council shall be appointed to
4	serve a 2-year term and may be reappointed.
5	(9) The State Board of Education, the Auditor General,
6	and the Office of Program Policy Analysis and Government
