21	(1) This section may be cited as the "Innovation
22	Florida Scholarships for Developing High-Tech Jobs Act."
23	(2) The Innovation Florida Scholarships for Developing
24	High-Tech Jobs Program is created to provide need-based
25	financial assistance to any Florida high school graduate who
26	merits recognition of high academic achievement and who
27	enrolls in a certified degree program at an eligible Florida
28	postsecondary educational institution within 3 years after
29	graduation from high school.
30	(3) As used in this section, the term:
31	(a) "Certified degree program" means a degree program 1

1	<u>that:</u>
2	1. Is certified by the Department of Education.
3	2. Addresses the need for support of degree programs
4	in targeted employment areas.
5	3. Includes an internship component as described in
6	this section.
7	(b) "Targeted employment" means employment in any of
8	the following business areas:
9	1. Advanced manufacturing, including the following:
10	a. Automotive and electronics.
11	b. Aerospace technology.
12	c. Robotics.
13	d. Engineering design technology.
14	2. Life sciences, including the following:
15	a. Orthopedics or medical devices.
16	b. Biomedical research or development.
17	c. Pharmaceutical manufacturing.
18	d. Agribusiness.
19	e. Nanotechnology or molecular manufacturing.
20	3. Information technology, including the following:
21	a. Informatics.
22	b. Certified network administration.
23	c. Software development.
24	d. Fiber optics.
25	4. High-technology logistics, including the following:
26	a. High-technology distribution.
27	b. Efficient and effective flow and storage of goods,

29	c. Intermodal ports.
30	(4) The Department of Education shall administer the
31	Innovation Florida Scholarships for Developing High-Tech Jobs

- 1 | Program according to rules and procedures established by the
- 2 State Board of Education. The department must advertise the
- 3 availability of the scholarship program and must notify
- 4 students, teachers, parents, quidance counselors, and
- 5 principals or other relevant school administrators of the
- 6 criteria and application procedures. The department must begin
- 7 this process of notification no later than January 1 of each
- 8 <u>year.</u>
- 9 (5) Funds for the Innovation Florida Scholarships for
 10 Developing High-Tech Jobs Program shall be appropriated
- annually in the General Appropriations Act.
- 12 <u>(a) If funds appropriated are not adequate to provide</u>
- 13 the maximum allowable award to each eligible applicant, awards
- 14 <u>must be prorated to each eligible applicant using the same</u>
- 15 percentage reduction.
- 16 (b) Notwithstanding s. 216.301, if all funds allocated
- 17 to the Innovative Florida Scholarships for Developing
- 18 | High-Tech Jobs Program are not used in any fiscal year, up to

- 21 (6) The department shall issue awards from the
- 22 scholarship program annually. Annual awards may be for up to
- 23 45 semester credit hours or the equivalent for the amount of
- 24 demonstrated unmet need for the cost of education, not to
- 25 exceed an amount equal to the average prior academic year cost
- 26 of tuition, fees, and assigned books and supplies at state

- director of the postsecondary educational institution, or his or her representative, except that the department may withhold 3 payment if the receiving institution fails to report or to make refunds to the department as required in this section. 4
 - (a) Within 30 days after the end of regular registration each semester, the educational institution shall certify to the department the eliqibility status of each student who receives an award. After the end of the drop and add period, an institution is not required to reevaluate or revise a student's eligibility status, but must make a refund to the department if a student who receives an award disbursement terminates enrollment for any reason during an academic term and a refund is permitted by the institution's refund policy.
 - (b) An institution that receives funds from the program shall certify to the department the amount of funds disbursed to each student and shall remit to the department any undisbursed advances within 60 days after the end of regular registration.
- (c) Each institution that receives moneys through this program shall prepare an annual report that includes an annual financial audit conducted by an independent certified public accountant or the Auditor General. The report shall include an audit of the institution's administration of the program and a complete accounting of the moneys for the program. This report must be submitted to the department annually by March 1. The department may conduct its own annual audit of an institution's administration of the program. The department may request a refund of any moneys overpaid to the institution for the program. The department may suspend or revoke an 31 | institution's eligibility to receive future moneys for the

- program if the department finds that an institution has not complied with this section. The institution must remit within 60 days any refund requested in accordance with this 4 subsection.
- 5 (7)(a) A student enrolled in 6 to 8 semester credit hours may receive up to one-half of the maximum award; a 6 student enrolled in 9 to 11 credit hours may receive up to three-fourths of the maximum award; and a student enrolled in 8 12 or more credit hours may receive up to the full award.
 - (b) If a recipient transfers from one eligible institution to another and continues to meet eligibility requirements, the award must be transferred with the student.
 - (c) A student may use an award for summer term enrollment if funds are available.
- 15 (d) Funds from a scholarship may not be used to pay 16 for remedial or college-preparatory coursework.
- (8) To be eligible for an initial award, a student 17 18 must:
- 19 (a) Be a Florida resident as defined in s. 1009.40 and 20 rules of the State Board of Education.
- (b) Earn a standard Florida high school diploma or its 2.2 equivalent as described in s. 1003.43 or s. 1003.45 unless:
- 1. The student is <u>enrolled full-time</u> in the early 23 admission program of an eligible postsecondary educational 24 25 institution or completes a home education program according to 26 s. 1002.41; or
- 27 2. The student earns a high school diploma from a 28 non-Florida school while living with a parent who is on 29 military or public service assignment away from Florida.
- 30 (c) Have achieved a cumulative grade point average of 31 at least 3.0 on a 4.0 scale or its equivalent in high school

- 1 | courses designated by the Department of Education, unless the
- 2 student has attended a home education program according to s.
- 3 1002.41 during grades 11 and 12, in which case the student
- 4 <u>must have attained at least the score identified by rules of</u>
- 5 the Department of Education on the combined verbal and
- 6 quantitative parts of the Scholastic Aptitude Test, the

16	a grant under this subsection must pay each student in the
17	internship program wages at a rate that is at least 120
18	percent of the federal minimum wage.
19	(12) The State Board of Education shall adopt rules
