 $\underline{(f)}$ (e) A late-payment fee in an amount not less than \$50 nor more than \$100 to be imposed on students who fail to pay or fail to make appropriate arrangements to pay (by means of installment payment, deferment, or third-party billing) tuition by the deadline set by each university. Each university may adopt specific procedures or policies for waiving the late-payment fee for minor underpayments.

 $\underline{(g)}(f)$ A fee for miscellaneous health-related charges for services provided at cost by the university health center which are not covered by the health fee set under subsection (10).

 $\underline{\text{(h)}}$ Materials and supplies fees to offset the cost of materials or supplies that are consumed in the course of the student's instructional activities, excluding the cost of equipment replacement, repairs, and maintenance.

 $\underline{\text{(i)}}$ (h) Housing rental rates and miscellaneous housing charges for services provided by the university at the request of the student.

 $\underline{\text{(j)}}$ (i) A charge representing the reasonable cost of efforts to collect payment of overdue accounts.

 $\underline{\text{(k)}}$ (j) A service charge on university loans in lieu of interest and administrative handling charges.

1 (1)(k) A fee for off-campus course offerings when the 2 location results in specific, identifiable increased costs to 3 the university. 4 (m)(1) Library fees and fines, including charges for 5 damaged and lost library materials, overdue reserve library 6 books, interlibrary loans, and literature searches. 7 (n) (m) Fees relating to duplicating, photocopying, 8 binding, and microfilming; copyright services; and 9 standardized testing.
