30	employment, engagement of services, or appointment, file with
31	the district school board for the district in which the

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charter school is located a complete set of fingerprints taken by an authorized law enforcement officer or an employee of the 3 school or district who is trained to take fingerprints. These fingerprints shall be submitted to the Department of Law 4 5 Enforcement for state processing and to the Federal Bureau of 6 Investigation for federal processing. The new employees or contractors shall be on probationary status pending 8 fingerprint processing and determination of compliance with standards of good moral character. Employees or contractors 9 found through fingerprint processing to have been convicted of 10 11 a crime involving moral turpitude shall not be employed or engaged to provide services in any position requiring direct 12 contact with students. Probationary employees or contractors 13 terminated because of their criminal record shall have the 14 15 right to appeal such decisions.
