Paragraph (f) is added to subsection (15) 21 of section 121.021, Florida Statutes, to read: 22 121.021 Definitions.--The following words and phrases 23 as used in this chapter have the respective meanings set forth unless a different meaning is plainly required by the context: 24 25 (15)26 (f) As of the effective date of this paragraph, the 27 term "special risk member" includes any member employed as a 28 mosquito control officer by a county or a mosquito control 29 district operating under chapter 388. 30 Section 2. Subsections (2) and (8) of section 121.0515, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:

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30 31 121.0515 Special risk membership.--

- (2) CRITERIA.--A member, to be designated as a special risk member, must meet the following criteria:
- (a) The member must be employed as a law enforcement officer and be certified, or required to be certified, in compliance with s. 943.1395; however, sheriffs and elected police chiefs shall be excluded from meeting the certification requirements of this paragraph. In addition, the member's duties and responsibilities must include the pursuit, apprehension, and arrest of law violators or suspected law violators; or the member must be an active member of a bomb disposal unit whose primary responsibility is the location, handling, and disposal of explosive devices; or the member must be the supervisor or command officer of a member or members who have such responsibilities; provided, however, administrative support personnel, including, but not limited to, those whose primary duties and responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, legal, and personnel, shall not be included;
- (b) The member must be employed as a firefighter and be certified, or required to be certified, in compliance with s. 633.35 and be employed solely within the fire department of a local government employer or an agency of state government with firefighting responsibilities. In addition, the member's duties and responsibilities must include on-the-scene fighting of fires, fire prevention, or firefighter training; direct supervision of firefighting units, fire prevention, or firefighter training; or aerial firefighting surveillance performed by fixed-wing aircraft pilots employed by the Division of Forestry of the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services; or the member must be the supervisor or

 command officer of a member or members who have such responsibilities; provided, however, administrative support personnel, including, but not limited to, those whose primary duties and responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, legal, and personnel, shall not be included and further provided that all periods of creditable service in fire prevention or firefighter training, or as the supervisor or command officer of a member or members who have such responsibilities, and for which the employer paid the special risk contribution rate, shall be included;

- (c) The member must be employed as a correctional officer and be certified, or required to be certified, in compliance with s. 943.1395. In addition, the member's primary duties and responsibilities must be the custody, and physical restraint when necessary, of prisoners or inmates within a prison, jail, or other criminal detention facility, or while on work detail outside the facility, or while being transported; or the member must be the supervisor or command officer of a member or members who have such responsibilities; provided, however, administrative support personnel, including, but not limited to, those whose primary duties and responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, legal, and personnel, shall not be included; however, wardens and assistant wardens, as defined by rule, shall participate in the Special Risk Class;
- (d) The member must be employed by a licensed Advance Life Support (ALS) or Basic Life Support (BLS) employer as an emergency medical technician or a paramedic and be certified in compliance with s. 401.27. In addition, the member's primary duties and responsibilities must include on-the-scene emergency medical care or direct supervision of emergency

medical technicians or paramedics, or the member must be the supervisor or command officer of one or more members who have such responsibility. However, administrative support personnel, including, but not limited to, those whose primary responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, legal, and personnel, shall not be included;

- (e) The member must be employed as a community-based correctional probation officer and be certified, or required to be certified, in compliance with s. 943.1395. In addition, the member's primary duties and responsibilities must be the supervised custody, surveillance, control, investigation, and counseling of assigned inmates, probationers, parolees, or community controllees within the community; or the member must be the supervisor of a member or members who have such responsibilities. Administrative support personnel, including, but not limited to, those whose primary duties and responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, legal services, and personnel management, shall not be included; however, probation and parole circuit and deputy circuit administrators shall participate in the Special Risk Class; or
- (f) The member must be employed in one of the following classes and must spend at least 75 percent of his or her time performing duties which involve contact with patients or inmates in a correctional or forensic facility or institution:
  - 1. Dietitian (class codes 5203 and 5204).
- 2. Public health nutrition consultant (class code 5224).
- 3. Psychological specialist (class codes 5230 and 5231).
  - 4. Psychologist (class code 5234).

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- The member must be employed as a youth custody officer and be certified, or required to be certified, in compliance with s. 943.1395. In addition, the member's primary duties and responsibilities must be the supervised custody, surveillance, control, investigation, apprehension, arrest, and counseling of assigned juveniles within the community; or.
- The member must be employed as a mosquito control officer by a county or a mosquito control district operating under chapter 388. Any mosquito control officer participating in the system on the effective date of this paragraph becomes a member of the special risk class on that date.
- (8) RESTORATION OF SPECIAL RISK CREDIT FOR SPECIFIED PERIOD OF EMPLOYMENT. --
- (a) A special risk member who was removed from the Special Risk Class effective October 1978, for the sole reason that he or she did not possess the required certificate or temporary waiver of certificate, and who obtained certification and was approved for special risk membership on or before June 30, 1982, shall be permitted to have special risk credit restored for that period upon:
- 1. (a) Certification by his or her employer that all requirements for special risk membership except the requirement for certification or temporary waiver of certification were met; and
- 2.(b) Payment of contributions equal to the difference in the contributions that were paid during the period and the contributions required for special risk members during that period, plus 6.5 percent interest thereon, compounded each June 30 from date of service until date of payment.

This credit may be purchased by the member or by the employer on behalf of the member.

enforcement officer of the Division of Recreation and Parks of the Department of Environmental Protection or the Division of Insurance Fraud of the Department of Insurance or who served in such capacity in a predecessor agency shall have special risk credit restored for the time the member spent as a member of the system and served as a law enforcement officer with power of arrest but was not credited with membership in the special risk class. If the member has retired or entered the Deferred Retirement Option Program of the system before the effective date of this paragraph, the restored special risk credit shall be applicable to future benefits. If the member is deceased, the restored special risk credit shall be applicable to future benefits beneficiaries.

Section 3. It is the intent of the Legislature that any additional costs attributable to increased retirement benefits paid as a result of the amendments by section 2 be funded by the necessary amount from the excess actuarial assets of the Florida Retirement System Trust Fund.

Section 4. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.

SENATE SUMMARY Makes mosquito control officers of counties and mosquito control districts members of the special risk class of the Florida Retirement System. Restores special risk membership benefits to persons employed as law enforcement officers by the Department of Environmental Protection and the Department of Insurance or their predecessor agencies and provides for funding such increased benefits from excess actuarial assets of the Florida Retirement System Trust Fund.
