WHEREAS, the renewable economic potential of the
Citrus/Hernando waterways is significant, and
WHEREAS, the Southwest Florida Water Management
District and the Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission,
along with other state, regional, and local entities, have
developed proposals to restore portions of the Citrus/Hernando
waterways, NOW, THEREFORE,
Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
Section 1. (1) The Citrus/Hernando Waterways Restoration
CouncilThere is created within the Withlacoochee and Coastal
Rivers Basin Boards of the Southwest Florida Water Management
District a council to be known as the Citrus/Hernando Waterways
Restoration Council. The council shall be coordinated by
representatives of the following agencies: the Florida Fish and
Wildlife Conservation Commission, the Department of
Environmental Protection, and the Southwest Florida Water
Management District. The council is subject to the provisions of
chapters 119 and 120, Florida Statutes.
(2) Members of the council shall consist of 12 voting
members with 6 appointed by the President of the Senate and 6
appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives. The
council shall consist of representatives as follows:
(a) A waterfront property owner from each county.
(b) An attorney from each county.
(c) A member of the Board of Directors of the Chamber
of Commerce from each county.
(d) An environmental engineer from each county.

51	(f) A person from each county with training in biology
52	or another scientific discipline.
3	(3) The council members from each county are to form
4	two separate county task forces from the council to review and
5	make recommendations on specific waterways. The Hernando
6	County Task Force shall develop plans for the restoration of
7	the Weeki Wachee River and Springs. The Citrus County Task
8	Force shall develop plans for the restoration of the
9	Tsala-Apopka Chain of Lakes.
0	(4) There shall be a technical advisory group to the
1	council and the two county task forces which shall consist of
2	one representative each from the Southwest Florida Water
3	Management District, the Department of Environmental
4	Protection, the Department of Transportation, the Fish and
5	Wildlife Conservation Commission, the Coastal Rivers Basin
6	Board, the Withlacoochee River Basin Board, and the United
7	States Army Corps of Engineers, each of whom shall be
8	appointed by his or her respective agency and each of whom,
9	with the exception of the representatives from the

3	(5) Immediately after appointment, the council shall
4	meet and organize by electing a chair, a vice chair, and a

7	member shall be a voting member. Additionally, the two county
8	task forces shall elect a chair and a secretary, whose terms
9	shall be for 2 years each.
0	(6) The council or the county task forces shall meet

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91	at the call of their respective chairs, at the request of six
92	members of the council or of the respective task force, or at
93	the request of the chair of the governing board of the Southwest
94	Florida Water Management District.
95	(7) The council shall have the powers and duties to:
96	(a) Review audits and all data specifically related to
97	lake and river restoration techniques and sport fish
98	population recovery strategies, including data and strategies
99	for shoreline restoration, sand and other sediment control and
100	removal, exotic species management, floating tussock
101	management or removal, navigation, water quality, and fish and
102	wildlife habitat improvement, particularly as they may apply

104	(b) Evaluate whether additional studies are needed.
105	(c) Explore all possible sources of funding to conduct
106	the restoration activities.
107	(d) Report to the Speaker of the House of

112	(8) The Southwest Florida Water Management District
113	shall act as lead entity for the purpose of providing staff
114	and administrative support to assist the council in carrying
115	out the provisions of this act.
116	(9) Members of the council shall receive no
117	compensation for their services but are entitled to be
118	reimbursed for per diem and travel expenses incurred during
119	execution of their official duties as provided in section
120	112.061, Florida Statutes. State and federal agencies shall be
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responsible for the per diem and travel expenses of their
respective appointees to the council, and the Southwest
Florida Water Management District shall be responsible for pe
diem and travel expenses of other appointees to the council.
Section 2. The Citrus/Hernando Waterways restoration
program
(1) The Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission and
the Southwest Florida Water Management District, in
conjunction with the Department of Environmental Protection,
pertinent local governments, and the Citrus/Hernando Waterway
Restoration Council, shall review existing restoration
proposals to determine which ones are the most environmental
sound and economically feasible methods of improving the fish
and wildlife habitat and natural systems of the
Citrus/Hernando waterways.
(2) To initiate the Citrus/Hernando Waterways
restoration program recommended by the Citrus/Hernando
Waterways Restoration Council, the Fish and Wildlife
Conservation Commission, with assistance from the Southwest
Florida Water Management District and in consultation and by
agreement with the Department of Environmental Protection and
pertinent local governments, shall develop tasks to be
considered by those entities for the enhancement of fish and
wildlife habitat. These tasks shall include the following:
(a) An evaluation of different methodologies for
removing the extensive tussocks and buildup of organic matter
along the shoreline and of the aquatic vegetation in the lake
(b) The conduct of any additional studies as required
by the Citrus/Hernando Waterways Restoration Council.
(3) Contingent on the Legislature's appropriating
