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A bill to be entitled An act relating to firefighters; creating s. 112.183, F.S.; providing that death or disability due to cancer suffered by a firefighter employed by the state or its political subdivisions is presumed accidental and suffered in the line of duty under certain conditions; authorizing purchase of insurance by local governments; providing criteria for physical exams for firefighters; requiring employing agency to keep records and notify firefighters of their reported exposure to known carcinogens; providing that firefighters employed on the effective date of the act need not comply with physical examination requirements; providing an effective date.

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WHEREAS, U.S. Department of Labor statistics show firefighting to be the nation's most dangerous occupation, with an on-the-job death rate more than twice that of law enforcement officers and nearly five times greater than the average for all industries, and

WHEREAS, firefighters are trained to risk their lives or bodily injury to protect the lives and property of the public, and

WHEREAS, firefighters are exposed by reason of their employment to smoke, fumes, and burning substances of a toxic, carcinogenic, or poisonous nature and are required by their employment to enter uncontrolled environments in the performance of their duties, unaware of and without regard for potentially harmful exposures, and

1 WHEREAS, the development of cancer may be slow and 2 cancer may not be manifested until many years after exposure 3 to the cancer-producing agent, and WHEREAS, it is fair and proper that firefighters be 4 5 compensated for death or disability due to exposure to 6 cancer-producing substances, NOW, THEREFORE, 7 8 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 9 10 Section 1. Section 112.183, Florida Statutes, is 11 created to read: 112.183 Firefighters; special provisions relative to 12 13 cancer.--14 (1) Any condition or impairment of health of a 15 firefighter employed full time by the state or any municipality, county, port authority, special tax district, or 16 17 fire control district which is caused by cancer and results in total or partial disability or death is presumed to have been 18 19 accidental and to have been suffered in the line of duty, 20 unless the contrary is shown by competent evidence. 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SENATE SUMMARY Provides that death or disability due to cancer suffered by a firefighter are employed full time by the state, a municipality, county, port authority, special tax district, or fire control district is presumed to be accidental and suffered in the line of duty unless the contrary is shown by competent evidence. The firefighter must have successfully passed a physical exam given either before or after employment which failed to reveal any evidence of a cancerous condition. The presumption does not apply to insurance contracts unless specifically provided. Authorizes such governmental entities to negotiate contracts for life and disability insurance that include this presumption. Prescribes types of that include this presumption. Prescribes types of examinations to be included in a physical examination. Requires employers to keep records and to notify firefighters of their reported exposure to known Provides that firefighters employed on the carcinogens. effective date of this act need not comply with the physical examination requirements of the act.
