An act relating to the medically needy program; amending s. 409.904, F.S.; postponing the effective date of changes to standards for eligibility for certain optional medical assistance, including coverage under the

assistance, including coverage under the medically needy program; providing appropriations; providing for retroactive application; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Subsection (2) of section 409.904, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

A bill to be entitled

409.904 Optional payments for eligible persons.—The agency may make payments for medical assistance and related services on behalf of the following persons who are determined to be eligible subject to the income, assets, and categorical eligibility tests set forth in federal and state law. Payment on behalf of these Medicaid eligible persons is subject to the availability of moneys and any limitations established by the General Appropriations Act or chapter 216.

(2) A caretaker relative or parent, a pregnant woman, a child under age 19 who would otherwise qualify for Florida Kidcare Medicaid, a child up to age 21 who would otherwise qualify under s. 409.903(1), a person age 65 or over, or a blind or disabled person, who would otherwise be eligible for Florida Medicaid, except that the income or assets of such family or person exceed established limitations. For a family or person in one of these coverage groups, medical expenses are deductible from income in accordance with federal

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requirements in order to make a determination of eligibility. Expenses used to meet spend-down liability are not reimbursable by Medicaid. Effective July May 1, 2003, when determining the eligibility of a pregnant woman, a child, or an aged, blind, or disabled individual, \$270 shall be deducted from the countable income of the filing unit. When determining the eligibility of the parent or caretaker relative as defined by Title XIX of the Social Security Act, the additional income disregard of \$270 does not apply. A family or person eligible under the coverage known as the "medically needy," is eligible to receive the same services as other Medicaid recipients, with the exception of services in skilled nursing facilities and intermediate care facilities for the developmentally disabled.

Section 2. The non-recurring sums of \$8,265,777 from the General Revenue Fund, \$2,505,224 from the Grants and Donations Trust Fund, and \$11,727,287 from the Medical Care Trust Fund are appropriated to the Agency for Health Care Administration to implement section 1 of this act during the 2002-2003 fiscal year.

Section 3. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law, but if it becomes a law after May 1, 2003, this act shall operate retroactively to that date.
