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25	Section 1. Section 487.2011, Florida Statutes, is
26	created to read:
27	487.2011 Short titleThis part may be cited as the
28	"Florida Agricultural Worker Safety Act" and shall be
29	administered by the Department of Agriculture and Consumer
30	Services.
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1	Section 2. Section 487.2021, Florida Statutes, is
2	created to read:
3	487.2021 Legislative intentIt is the intent of the
4	Legislature, by this part, to ensure that agricultural workers
5	employed in the state receive protection from agricultural
6	pesticides. The Legislature intends to assure that
7	agricultural workers be given information concerning
8	agricultural pesticides.
9	Section 3. Section 487.2031, Florida Statutes, is
10	created to read:
11	487.2031 DefinitionsFor purposes of this part, the
12	term:
13	(1) "Agricultural employer" means any person who hires
14	or contracts for the services of workers, for any type of
15	compensation, to perform activities related to the production
16	of agricultural plants, or any person who is an owner of or is
17	responsible for the management or condition of an agricultural
18	establishment that uses such workers.
19	(2) "Agricultural establishment" means any farm,
20	forest, nursery, or greenhouse.
21	(3) "Agricultural plant" means any plant grown or
22	maintained for commercial or research purposes and includes,
23	but is not limited to, food, feed, and fiber plants, trees,
24	turfgrass, flowers, shrubs, ornamentals, and seedlings.
25	(4) "Department" means the Department of Agriculture
26	and Consumer Services or its authorized representative.
27	(5) "Designated representative" means any person or
28	organization to whom a worker gives written authorization to
29	exercise the right to request the agricultural pesticide
30	information pursuant to this part.
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1	(6) "Fact sheet" means any state or federally approved
2	fact sheet.
3	(7) "Material safety data sheet" means written or
4	printed material concerning an agricultural pesticide which
5	sets forth the following information:
6	(a) The chemical name and the common name of the
7	agricultural pesticide.
8	(b) The hazards or other risks in the use of the
9	agricultural pesticide, including:
10	1. The potential for fire, explosions, corrosivity,
11	and reactivity.
12	2. The known acute health effects and chronic health
13	effects of risks from exposure to the agricultural pesticide,
14	including those medical conditions which are generally
15	recognized as being aggravated by exposure to the agricultural
16	pesticide.
17	3. The primary routes of entry and symptoms of
18	overexposure.
19	(c) The proper precautions, handling practices,
20	necessary personal protective equipment, and other safety
21	precautions in the use of or exposure to the agricultural
22	pesticide, including appropriate emergency treatment in case
23	of overexposure.
24	(d) The emergency procedures for spills, fire,
25	disposal, and first aid.
26	(e) A description of the known specific potential
27	health risks posed by the agricultural pesticide, which
28	description is written in lay terms and is intended to alert
29	any person who reads the information.
30	(f) The year and the month, if available, that the
31	information was compiled and the name, address, and emergency

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1 telephone number of the manufacturer responsible for preparing 2 the information. 3 (8) "Retaliation" means actions, such as dismissal, demotion, harassment, blacklisting with other employers, 4 5 reducing pay or work hours, or taking away company housing, by any agricultural employer against any worker who exercises any б 7 right under the United States Environmental Protection Agency 8 Worker Protection Standard, 40 C.F.R. s. 170.7(b) (August 21, 1992) or this part. 9 10 (9) "Trainer" means any person who qualifies to train 11 workers under the pesticide safety training requirements of the United States Environmental Protection Agency Worker 12 Protection Standard, 40 C.F.R. s. 170.130 (August 21, 1992). 13 (10) "Worker" means any person, including a farmworker 14 or a self-employed person, who is employed for any type of 15 compensation and who is performing activities relating to the 16 production of agricultural plants on an agricultural 17 establishment. The term "worker" does not include any person 18 19 employed by a commercial pesticide handling establishment to perform tasks as crop advisors. 20 Section 4. Section 487.2041, Florida Statutes, is 21 22 created to read: 487.2041 Enforcement of federal worker protection 23 24 regulations. -- The department shall continue to operate under 25 the regulations established by the United States Environmental Protection Agency Labeling Requirement for Pesticides and 26 27 Devices, 40 C.F.R. part 156, and the Worker Protection Standard, 40 C.F.R. part 170, adopted August 21, 1992, which 28 29 the department adopted by rule, during the 1995-1996 fiscal 30 year, to the Florida Administrative Code. Any provisions of 31

Section 487.2051, Florida Statutes, is created to read: 4 5 487.2051 Availability of agricultural pesticide б information to workers and physicians .--7 (1)(a) The agricultural employer shall make available 8 agricultural pesticide information concerning any agricultural pesticide to any worker who enters an agricultural pesticide 9 treated area on an agricultural establishment where, within 10 11 the last 30 days, an agricultural pesticide has been applied or a restricted-entry interval has been in effect or to any 12 worker who may be exposed to the agricultural pesticide during 13 normal conditions of use or in a foreseeable emergency. 14 The agricultural pesticide information shall be in 15 (b) the form of a material safety data sheet or a state or 16 17 federally approved fact sheet. The agricultural employer shall provide a written copy of the information specified in 18 19 this section within 2 working days of a request for the information by a worker, a designated representative of the 20 worker, or medical personnel treating the worker. 21 (c) The distributor, manufacturer, or importer of 22 agricultural pesticides shall prepare and provide each direct 23 24 purchaser of agricultural pesticides with a material safety data sheet. If the material safety data sheet or fact sheet 25 for the agricultural pesticide is not available at the time 26 27 the agricultural pesticide is purchased, the agricultural employer shall take appropriate and timely steps to obtain the 28 29 material safety data sheet or fact sheet from the distributor, 30 the manufacturer, the department, a federal agency, or another 31 distribution source.

2	the one-page general agricultural pesticide safety sheet
3	designed by the department. The safety sheet shall always be
4	in a language understood by the worker and must include, but
5	is not limited to, illustrated instructions on prevention of
6	agricultural pesticide exposure and toll-free numbers to the
7	Florida Poison Control Centers. The trainer shall provide the
8	safety sheet to the worker at the time of training pursuant to
9	the United States Environmental Protection Agency Worker
10	Protection Standard, 40 C.F.R. s. 170.130 (August 21, 1992).
11	Section 6. Section 487.2061, Florida Statutes, is
12	created to read:
13	487.2061 Prohibited actsIt is unlawful for any
14	agricultural employer to:
15	(1) Fail to provide agricultural pesticide information
16	as provided for in this part.
17	(2) Take any retaliatory action against any worker for
18	exercising any right under the provisions of the United States
19	Environmental Protection Agency Worker Protection Standard, 40
20	C.F.R. s. 170.7(b) (August 21, 1992), or this part.
21	Section 7. Section 487.2071, Florida Statutes, is
22	created to read:
23	487.2071 Penalties against agricultural employer
24	violators; worker relief; monitoring complaints of
25	retaliation
26	(1) Penalties set forth in part I of this chapter
27	shall be applied to any agricultural employer who violates any
28	provision in this part. Agricultural employers who violate the
29	provisions of this part also shall be subject to the federal
30	penalties in the United States Environmental Protection Agency
31	Worker Protection Standard, 40 C.F.R. s. 170.9(b).

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1	(2)(a) Any worker who has been retaliated against by
2	any agricultural employer for exercising any right under the
3	United States Environmental Protection Agency Worker
4	Protection Standard, 40 C.F.R. s. 170.7(b) (August 21, 1992)
5	or this part, may seek relief under ss. 448.102-448.104.
6	(b) Any worker who has been retaliated against by any
7	agricultural employer for exercising any right under the
8	United States Environmental Protection Agency Worker
9	Protection Standard, 40 C.F.R. s. 170.7(b) (August 21, 1992)
10	or this part and seeks relief pursuant to this section, or the
11	worker's designated representative, shall file a complaint
12	with the department of such retaliation.
13	(c) In any action brought pursuant to this section
14	where the retaliatory personnel action is predicated upon the
15	disclosure of an illegal activity, policy, or practice to an
16	appropriate governmental agency, the worker shall not be
17	required to show that the disclosure to the government agency
18	was under oath or in writing or that the notification to the
19	employer concerning the illegal activity, policy, or practice
20	was in writing as provided in s. 448.102(1).
21	(3) The department shall monitor all complaints of
22	retaliation which it receives and report its findings to the
23	President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of
24	Representatives on October 1, 2006. The report shall include
25	the number of such complaints received, the circumstances
26	surrounding the complaints, and the action taken concerning
27	the complaints.
28	Section 8. The Division of Statutory Revision is
29	requested to designate sections 487.011-487.175, Florida
30	Statutes, as part I of that chapter and sections
31	487.2011-487.2071, Florida Statutes, as created by this act,
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1	as part II of that chapter. The division is further requested
2	to name part II the "Florida Agricultural Worker Safety Act."
3	Section 9. This act shall take effect July 1, 2003.
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5	STATEMENT OF SUBSTANTIAL CHANGES CONTAINED IN
6	COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR Senate Bill 2558
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8	The Committee Substitute for Senate Bill 2558 is different
9	from Senate Bill 2558 in that it:
10	1. Requires the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services (department) to continue to operate under the
11	regulations established by the United States Environmental Protection Agency's Labeling Requirement for Pesticides and Devices and the Worker Protection
12	for Pesticides and Devices and the Worker Protection Standards, adopted August 21, 1992, which the department adopted by rule, during the 1995-1996 fiscal year to the
13	adopted by rule, during the 1995-1996 fiscal year to the Florida Administrative Code.
14	2. Requires the department to make available to a trainer
15	the one page general agricultural pesticide safety sheet designed by the department. The safety sheet shall
16	always be in a language understood by the worker, must include specified information and be provided to the
17	worker at the time of training.
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
