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18	Section 1. Section 468.352, Florida Statutes, is

22	468.352 DefinitionsAs used in this part, the term:
23	(1) "Board" means the Board of Respiratory Care.
24	(2) "Certified respiratory therapist" means any person
25	licensed pursuant to this part who is certified by the
26	National Board for Respiratory Care or its successor; who is
27	employed to deliver respiratory care services, under the order
28	of a physician licensed pursuant to chapter 458 or chapter
29	459, in accordance with protocols established by a hospital or
30	other health care provider or the board; and who functions in
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1 situations of unsupervised patient contact requiring 2 individual judgment. 3 (3) "Critical care" means care given to a patient in 4 any setting involving a life-threatening emergency. 5 "Department" means the Department of Health. (4) б (5) "Direct supervision" means practicing under the direction of a licensed, registered, or certified respiratory 7 8 therapist who is physically on the premises and readily 9 available, as defined by the board. (6) 10 "Physician supervision" means supervision and 11 control by a physician licensed under chapter 458 or chapter 459 who assumes the legal liability for the services rendered 12 by the personnel employed in his or her office. Except in the 13 case of an emergency, physician supervision requires the easy 14 availability of the physician within the office or the 15 physical presence of the physician for consultation and 16 17 direction of the actions of the persons who deliver respiratory care services. 18 19 (7) "Practice of respiratory care" or "respiratory therapy" means the allied health specialty associated with the 20 21 cardiopulmonary system that is practiced under the orders of a physician licensed under chapter 458 or chapter 459 and in 22 accordance with protocols, policies, and procedures 23 24 established by a hospital or other health care provider or the board, including the assessment, diagnostic evaluation, 25 treatment, management, control, rehabilitation, education, and 26 27 care of patients in all care settings. (8) "Registered respiratory therapist" means any 28 29 person licensed under this part who is registered by the 30 National Board for Respiratory Care or its successor, and who 31 is employed to deliver respiratory care services under the

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1 order of a physician licensed under chapter 458 or chapter 459, in accordance with protocols established by a hospital or 2 3 other health care provider or the board, and who functions in situations of unsupervised patient contact requiring 4 5 individual judgment. 6 (9) "Respiratory care practitioner" means any person 7 licensed under this part who is employed to deliver 8 respiratory care services, under direct supervision, pursuant 9 to the order of a physician licensed under chapter 458 or 10 chapter 459. 11 (10) "Respiratory care services" includes: 12 (a) Evaluation and disease management. (b) Diagnostic and therapeutic use of respiratory 13 equipment, devices, or medical gas. 14 15 Administration of drugs, as duly ordered or (C) prescribed by a physician licensed under chapter 458 or 16 17 chapter 459 and in accordance with protocols, policies, and procedures established by a hospital or other health care 18 19 provider or the board. 20 (d) Initiation, management, and maintenance of 21 equipment to assist and support ventilation and respiration. 22 (e) Diagnostic procedures, research, and therapeutic 23 treatment and procedures, including measurement of ventilatory volumes, pressures, and flows; specimen collection and 24 25 analysis of blood for gas transport and acid/base 26 determinations; pulmonary-function testing; and other related 27 physiological monitoring of cardiopulmonary systems. 28 (f) Cardiopulmonary rehabilitation. (g) Cardiopulmonary resuscitation, advanced cardiac 29 30 life support, neonatal resuscitation, and pediatric advanced life support, or equivalent functions. 31

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1 (h) Insertion and maintenance of artificial airways 2 and intravascular catheters. 3 (i) Performing sleep-disorder studies. (j) Education of patients, families, the public, or 4 5 other health care providers, including disease process and б management programs and smoking prevention and cessation 7 programs. 8 (k) Initiation and management of hyperbaric oxygen. Section 2. Section 468.355, Florida Statutes, is 9 10 amended to read: 11 (Substantial rewording of section. See s. 468.355, F.S., for present text.) 12 468.355 Licensure requirements.--To be eligible for 13 licensure by the board, an applicant must be an active 14 'Certified Respiratory Therapist" or be an active "Registered 15 Respiratory Therapist" by the National Board for Respiratory 16 Care, or its successor. 17 Section 3. Section 468.368, Florida Statutes, is 18 19 amended to read: (Substantial rewording of section. See 20 s. 468.368, F.S., for present text.) 21 468.368 Exemptions. -- This part may not be construed to 22 prevent or restrict the practice, service, or activities of: 23 24 (1) Any person licensed in this state by any other law 25 from engaging in the profession or occupation for which he or 26 she is licensed. 27 (2) Any legally qualified person in the state or 28 another state or territory who is employed by the United 29 States Government or any agency thereof while such person is 30 discharging his or her official duties. 31

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1	(3) A friend or family member who is providing
2	respiratory care services to an ill person and who does not
3	represent himself or herself to be a respiratory care
4	practitioner or respiratory therapist.
5	(4) An individual providing respiratory care services
6	in an emergency who does not represent himself or herself as a
7	respiratory care practitioner or respiratory therapist.
8	(5) Any individual employed to deliver, assemble, set
9	up, or test equipment for use in a home, upon the order of a
10	physician licensed pursuant to chapter 458 or chapter 459.
11	This subsection does not, however, authorize the practice of
12	respiratory care without a license.
13	(6) Any individual performing polysomnography under
14	medical direction, as related to the diagnosis and evaluation
15	of treatment for sleep disorders.
16	(7) Any individual certified or registered as a
17	pulmonary function technologist who is credentialed by the
18	National Board for Respiratory Care for performing
19	cardiopulmonary diagnostic studies.
20	(8) Any student who is enrolled in an accredited
21	respiratory care program approved by the board, while
22	performing respiratory care as an integral part of a required
23	course.
24	(9) The delivery of incidental respiratory care to
25	noninstitutionalized persons by surrogate family members who
26	do not represent themselves as registered or certified
27	respiratory care therapists.
28	(10) Any individual credentialed by the Underseas
29	Hyperbaric Society in hyperbaric medicine or its equivalent as
30	determined by the board, while performing related duties. This
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subsection does not, however, authorize the practice of respiratory care without a license. Section 4. Sections 468.356 and 468.357, Florida Statutes, are repealed, effective January 1, 2004. Section 5. Except as otherwise expressly provided in б this act, this act shall take effect upon becoming a law. STATEMENT OF SUBSTANTIAL CHANGES CONTAINED IN COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR Senate Bill 2618 An exemption to respiratory care services licensure is created for any individual performing polysomnography under medical direction as related to the diagnosis and evaluation of treatment for sleep disorders. The exemption no longer requires an individual to be credentialed by the Board of Registered Polysomnographic Technologists as a registered polysomnographic technologist.
