## I. Summary:

This bill designates the Skypass Bridge (bridge number 930470) in the City of Riviera Beach in Palm Beach County as the "L. E. Buie Bridge." Also, this bill directs Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) to erect suitable markers.

#### II. Present Situation:

Section 334.071, F.S., provides for legislative designations of transportation facilities for honorary or memorial purposes, or to distinguish a particular facility, and may not be construed to require any action by local governments or private parties regarding the changing of any street signs, mailing addresses, or 911 emergency telephone number system listings, unless the legislation specifically provides for such changes. The section further provides when the Legislature establishes road or bridge designations FDOT is required to place markers only at the termini specified for each highway segment or bridge designated by the law creating the designation, and to erect any other markers it deems appropriate for the transportation facility.

# III. Effect of Proposed Changes:

This bill designates the Skypass Bridge (bridge number 930470) in the City of Riviera Beach in Palm Beach County as the "L. E. Buie Bridge." Also, this bill directs FDOT to erect suitable markers.
