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- (3) "Critical care" means care given to a patient in any setting involving a life-threatening emergency.
 - (4) "Department" means the Department of Health.
- (5) "Direct supervision" means practicing under the direction of a licensed, registered, or certified respiratory therapist who is physically on the premises and readily available, as defined by the board.
- 8 (6) "Physician supervision" means supervision and control by a physician licensed under chapter 458 or chapter 9 459 who assumes the legal liability for the services rendered 10 11 by the personnel employed in his or her office. Except in the 12 case of an emergency, physician supervision requires the easy 13 availability of the physician within the office or the physical presence of the physician for consultation and 14 15 direction of the actions of the persons who deliver 16 respiratory care services.
 - (7) "Practice of respiratory care" or "respiratory therapy" means the allied health specialty associated with the cardiopulmonary system that is practiced under the orders of a physician licensed under chapter 458 or chapter 459 and in accordance with protocols, policies, and procedures established by a hospital or other health care provider or the board, including the assessment, diagnostic evaluation, treatment, management, control, rehabilitation, education, and care of patients in all care settings.
- (8) "Registered respiratory therapist" means any person licensed under this part who is registered by the National Board for Respiratory Care or its successor, and who is employed to deliver respiratory care services under the order of a physician licensed under chapter 458 or chapter 31 | 459, in accordance with protocols established by a hospital or

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chapter 459.

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- other health care provider or the board, and who functions in situations of unsupervised patient contact requiring individual judgment.
- (9) "Respiratory care practitioner" means any person

 licensed under this part who is employed to deliver

 respiratory care services, under direct supervision, pursuant

 to the order of a physician licensed under chapter 458 or
 - (10) "Respiratory care services" includes:
- 10 (a) Evaluation and disease management.
- 11 (b) Diagnostic and therapeutic use of respiratory
 12 equipment, devices, or medical gas.

 chapter 459 and in accordance with protocols, policies, and
 procedures established by a hospital or other health care
 provider or the board.
 - (d) Initiation, management, and maintenance of equipment to assist and support ventilation and respiration.
- (e) Diagnostic procedures, research, and therapeutic
 treatment and procedures, including measurement of ventilatory
 volumes, pressures, and flows; specimen collection and
 analysis of blood for gas transport and acid/base
 determinations; pulmonary-function testing; and other related
 physiological monitoring of cardiopulmonary systems.

 This subsection does not, however, authorize the practice of respiratory care without a license.
 - (6) Any individual performing polysomnography under medical direction, as related to the diagnosis and evaluation of treatment for sleep disorders.
 - (7) Any individual certified or registered as a pulmonary function technologist who is credentialed by the National Board for Respiratory Care for performing cardiopulmonary diagnostic studies.
 - (8) Any student who is enrolled in an accredited respiratory care program approved by the board, while performing respiratory care as an integral part of a required course.
 - (9) The delivery of incidental respiratory care to noninstitutionalized persons by surrogate family members who do not represent themselves as registered or certified respiratory care therapists.
- 25 (10) Any individual credentialed by the Underseas
 26 Hyperbaric Society in hyperbaric medicine or its equivalent as
 27 determined by the board, while performing related duties. This
 28 subsection does not, however, authorize the practice of
 29 respiratory care without a license.
