The 26 27 Legislature further finds that strong, viable independent 2.8 for-profit colleges and universities reduce the tax burden on 29 the residents of the state. Because the Access to Better 30 Learning and Education Grant Program is not related to a

Legislature that the Access to Better Learning and Education
Grant Program not be considered a financial aid program but
rather a tuition assistance program for state residents.

- (2) The Access to Better Learning and Education Grant
 Program shall be administered by the Department of Education.
 The State Board of Education shall adopt rules for administering the program.
- The department shall issue an access grant to any (3) full-time student seeking a baccalaureate degree who is registered at a for-profit college or university that is located in and chartered by the state; that is accredited by the Commission on Colleges of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools; or a nonprofit college or university that is chartered out of the state and located in the state for 10 years or more and is accredited by the Commission on Colleges of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools, the Middle States Accrediting Agency, the North Central Accrediting Agency, or the New England Accrediting Agency; that grants baccalaureate degrees; that is not a state university or state community college; and that has a secular purpose, if the receipt of state aid by students at the institution would not have the primary effect of advancing or impeding religion or result in an excessive entanglement between the state and any religious sect. Institutions eligible for the Access to Better Learning and Education Grant Program in the initial year of funding shall include only those for-profit colleges or universities identified in this subsection. Nonprofit colleges or universities identified in this section shall be eligible for financial support in the second year of funding.

1 (4) A person is eligible to receive an access grant
2 if:
3 (a) He or she meets the general requirements.

- (a) He or she meets the general requirements, including residency, for student eligibility as provided in section 1009.40, Florida Statutes, except as otherwise provided in this section; and
- (b)1. He or she is enrolled as a full-time undergraduate student at an eligible college or university in a program of study leading to a baccalaureate degree;
- 2. He or she is not enrolled in a program of study leading to a degree in theology or divinity; and
- 3. He or she is making satisfactory academic progress as defined by the college or university in which he or she is enrolled.
- (5)(a) The amount of the access grant issued to a full-time student shall be an amount specified in the General Appropriations Act. The access grant may be paid on a prorated basis in advance of the registration period. The department shall make payments to the college or university in which the student is enrolled for credit to the student's account for payment of tuition and fees. Institutions shall certify to the department the amount of funds disbursed to each student and shall remit to the department any undisbursed advances or refunds within 60 days after the end of regular registration. A student may not receive the award for more than 9 semesters or 14 quarters, except as otherwise provided in section 1009.40(3), Florida Statutes.
- (b) If the combined amount of the access grant issued pursuant to this section and all other scholarships and grants for tuition or fees exceeds the amount charged to the student

for tuition and fees, the department shall reduce the grant issued under this section by an amount equal to the excess. (6) If the number of eligible students exceeds the total authorized in the General Appropriations Act, an institution may use its own resources to assure that each eligible student receives the full benefit of the grant amount authorized. (7) This section shall be implemented only to the extent specifically funded and authorized by law. Section 2. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law. STATEMENT OF SUBSTANTIAL CHANGES CONTAINED IN COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR s0638 The Committee Substitute clarifies that the grant program is to be implemented only to the extent funded specifically by law. Further, secular, non-profit colleges and universities chartered out-of-state may participate in the program only if located in Florida for 10 years or more and accredited regionally. These schools are eligible only in the second year of funding for the program.
