3	creating the Access to Better Learning and
4	Education Grant Program; providing legislative
5	findings with respect to education provided by

10	appropriation; requiring institutions to remit
11	undisbursed funds to the department; limiting
12	the period a student may receive a grant;
13	providing for implementation only to the extent
14	funded and authorized by law; providing an
15	effective date.

17	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
18	
19	Section 1. The Access to Better Learning and Education
20	Grant Program
21	(1) The Legislature finds and declares that
22	independent for-profit colleges and universities eligible to
23	participate in the Access to Better Learning and Education
24	Grant Program are an integral part of the higher education
25	system in this state and that a significant number of state
26	residents choose this form of higher education. The
27	Legislature further finds that strong, viable independent
28	for-profit colleges and universities reduce the tax burden on
29	the residents of the state. Because the Access to Better
30	Learning and Education Grant Program is not related to a
31	student's financial need or other criteria upon which

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financial aid programs are based, it is the intent of the 1 2 Legislature that the Access to Better Learning and Education 3 Grant Program not be considered a financial aid program but 4 rather a tuition assistance program for state residents. 5 The Access to Better Learning and Education Grant (2) 6 Program shall be administered by the Department of Education. 7 The State Board of Education shall adopt rules for 8 administering the program. 9 (3) The department shall issue an access grant to any full-time student seeking a baccalaureate degree who is 10 registered at a for-profit college or university that is 11 12 located in and chartered by the state and that is accredited 13 by the Commission on Colleges of the Southern Association of 14 Colleges and Schools or who is registered at a nonprofit 15 college or university that is chartered out of the state, that has been located in the state for 10 years or more, and that 16 17 is accredited by the Commission on Colleges of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools, the Middle States 18 19 Association of Colleges and Schools, the North Central 20 Association of Colleges and Schools, or the New England Association of Colleges and Schools; that grants baccalaureate 21 degrees; that is not a state university or state community 22 23 college; and that has a secular purpose, if the receipt of state aid by students at the institution would not have the 24 primary effect of advancing or impeding religion or result in 25 26 an excessive entanglement between the state and any religious sect. Institutions eligible for the Access to Better Learning 27 and Education Grant Program in the initial year of funding 28 29 shall include only those for-profit colleges or universities 30 identified in this subsection. Nonprofit colleges or 31 2

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universities identified in this subsection shall be eligible 1 2 for financial support in the second year of funding. 3 (4) A person is eligible to receive an access grant 4 if: 5 (a) He or she meets the general requirements, 6 including residency, for student eligibility as provided in 7 section 1009.40, Florida Statutes, except as otherwise 8 provided in this section; and 9 (b)1. He or she is enrolled as a full-time undergraduate student at an eligible college or university in 10 a program of study leading to a baccalaureate degree; 11 12 2. He or she is not enrolled in a program of study leading to a degree in theology or divinity; and 13 14 3. He or she is making satisfactory academic progress 15 as defined by the college or university in which he or she is 16 enrolled. 17 (5)(a) The amount of the access grant issued to a full-time student shall be an amount specified in the General 18 19 Appropriations Act. The access grant may be paid on a prorated 20 basis in advance of the registration period. The department shall make payments to the college or university in which the 21 student is enrolled for credit to the student's account for 22 payment of tuition and fees. Institutions shall certify to the 23 department the amount of funds disbursed to each student and 24 shall remit to the department any undisbursed advances or 25 26 refunds within 60 days after the end of regular registration. 27 A student may not receive the award for more than 9 semesters or 14 quarters, except as otherwise provided in section 28 29 1009.40(3), Florida Statutes. (b) If the combined amount of the access grant issued 30 pursuant to this section and all other scholarships and grants 31 3

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for tuition or fees exceeds the amount charged to the student for tuition and fees, the department shall reduce the grant issued under this section by an amount equal to the excess. (6) If the number of eligible students exceeds the total authorized in the General Appropriations Act, an institution may use its own resources to assure that each eligible student receives the full benefit of the grant amount authorized. (7) This section shall be implemented only to the extent specifically funded and authorized by law. Section 2. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.
