I. Summary:

This legislation re-creates the Food and Nutrition Services Trust Fund, FLAIR number 482315, which is administered by the Department of Education. Re-creation is effective for four years beginning on November 4, 2004, the current termination date of the fund. This fund was last recreated effective November 4, 2000, by Chapter 99-37, Laws of Florida.

II. Present Situation:

Section 1010.77, F.S., restates the fund's creation and purpose. The School Food Service is authorized in s.1006.06.

The purpose of the fund is to record the revenue and disbursement of funds from the United States Department of Agriculture for the various school and day care food programs authorized by the National School Lunch Act.

The major source of revenue for the fund is federal food service funds. According to LAS/PBS data, receipts to this fund for FY 2001-2002 were \$450.3 million.

III. Effect of Proposed Changes:

This bill re-creates the trust fund without modification.
