I. Summary:

This legislation re-creates the Knott Data Center Working Capital Trust Fund, FLAIR number 482792, which is administered by the Department of Education. Re-creation is effective for four years beginning on November 4, 2004, the current termination date of the fund. This fund was last re-created effective November 4, 2000, by Chapter 99-29, Laws of Florida.

II. Present Situation:

Section 1010.81, F.S., restates the fund's creation and purpose.

The trust fund allows the Department of Education to record the revenue from fees paid for services provided by the Department of Education's data center and disbursements to pay the costs of operating the data center.

The major sources of revenue for the Knott Data Center Working Capital Trust Fund are data processing funds appropriated to the budget entities that are served by the Knott Data Center. According to LAS/PBS data, receipts to this fund for FY 2001-2002 were \$6.4 million.

III. Effect of Proposed Changes:

This bill re-creates the trust fund without modification.
