I. Summary:

This legislation re-creates the State University System Law Enforcement Trust Fund, FLAIR number 492434, which is administered by the State University System. Re-creation is effective for four years beginning on November 4, 2004. This fund was last reviewed effective November 4, 2000, by Chapter 99-243, Laws of Florida.

II. Present Situation:

The trust fund is created in Section 932.7055(5)(h) Florida Statures as a depository for contraband pursuant to the Florida Contraband Forfeiture Act.

The major sources of revenue for the fund are contraband forfeiture. According to LAS/PBS data, receipts to this fund for FY 2001-2002 were \$45,405.

This bill re-creates the trust fund without modification.
