### I. Summary:

This legislation re-creates the Invasive Plant Control Trust Fund without modification, effective November 4, 2004. The Invasive Plant Control Trust Fund, FLAIR #37-2-030, is administered by the Department of Environmental Protection. This fund was last re-created effective November 4, 2000, by Chapter 99-312, Laws of Florida.

#### II. Present Situation:

Sections 201.15, 206.606 and 328.76, F.S., provide revenue sources for the fund. Section 369.252, F.S., provides for the use of the fund. The purpose of the fund is to provide resources to eradicate or maintain control of invasive exotic plants on public lands. The major sources of revenue for the fund are documentary stamp tax revenues, gas tax revenues, and vessel registration fees. According to LAS/PBS data, receipts to this fund for FY 2001-2002 were \$41.3 million.

## III. Effect of Proposed Changes:

This bill re-creates the trust fund without modification.
