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I. Summary:

This legislation re-creates the Drinking Water Revolving Loan Trust Fund without modification, effective November 4, 2004. The Drinking Water Revolving Loan Trust Fund, FLAIR # 37-2-044, is administered by the Department of Environmental Protection. This fund was last recreated effective November 4, 2000, by Chapter 99-108, Laws of Florida.

II. Present Situation:

Section 403.8533, F.S., creates the trust fund. Section 403.8532, F.S., provides for the use of the fund. The fund provides for low-interest loans for planning, engineering, design and construction of public drinking water systems and improvements to such systems. The major sources of revenue for the fund are transfers of General Revenue matching funds, federal grant funds, and loan repayments. According to LAS/PBS data, receipts to this fund for FY 2001-2002 were \$208.5 million.

III. Effect of Proposed Changes:

This bill re-creates the trust fund without modification.
