A bill to be entitled

An act relating to death sentence proceedings; amending s. 922.07, F.S.; modifying circumstances under which the Governor must stay execution of the sentence of death; providing for construction of the act in pari materia with laws enacted during the 2003 Regular Session of the Legislature; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

- Section 1. Subsection (1) of section 922.07, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:
- 922.07 Proceedings when person under sentence of death appears to be insane.--
- Governor is informed no later than 48 hours prior to a scheduled execution, that a person under sentence of death may be insane, the Governor shall stay execution of the sentence and appoint a commission of three psychiatrists to examine the convicted person. The Governor shall notify the psychiatrists in writing that they are to examine the convicted person to determine whether he or she understands the nature and effect of the death penalty and why it is to be imposed upon him or her. The examination of the convicted person shall take place with all three psychiatrists present at the same time. Counsel for the convicted person and the state attorney may be present at the examination. If the convicted person does not have counsel, the court that imposed the sentence shall appoint counsel to represent him or her.
  - Section 2. If any law amended by this act was also amended

by a law enacted at the 2003 Regular Session of the Legislature,

such laws shall be construed as if they had been enacted at the

same session of the Legislature, and full effect shall be given

to each if possible.

Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2003.
