20	plan for expediting implementation statewide or, in hospitals
21	where the agency determines that implementation of such systems
22	is not practicable, alternative methods to reduce medication
23	errors. The agency shall identify in its plan any barriers to
24	statewide implementation and shall include recommendations to
25	the Legislature of statutory changes that may be necessary to
26	eliminate those barriers. The agency shall review newly
27	developed plans for compliance with statewide initiatives and to
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28 determine both the commitment of the health care facility staff

29 and the capability of the facility to successfully coordinate

30 and implement these plans, especially from a technological

31 perspective.

2. "Medication error" is any preventable event that may 32 33 cause or lead to inappropriate medication use or patient harm 34 while the medication is in the control of the health care professional, patient, or consumer. Such events may be related 35 36 to professional practice, health care products, health care 37 procedures, and health care systems, each of which may include 38 the prescribing of medications and order communications; product 39 labeling; product packaging; the nomenclature, compounding, dispensing, distribution, administration, and use of 40

41 medications; and education and monitoring related thereto.
