I. Summary:

This bill re-creates the Florida Preservation 2000 Trust Fund without modification, effective November 4, 2004, and clarifies that it is not exempt from the termination provision of Section 19(f), Article III, State Constitution. The Florida Preservation 2000 Trust Fund, FLAIR #52-2-332, is administered by the Department of Community Affairs. This fund was last re-created effective November 4, 2000, by Chapter 2000-118, Laws of Florida.

II. Present Situation:

The Florida Preservation 2000 Trust Fund was created pursuant to s. 375.045, F.S., to provide land acquisition grants and loans to local governments for the preservation of endangered lands. These local government grants and loans are funded through bond proceeds in accordance with ss. 259.101 and 375.045, F.S.

III. Effect of Proposed Changes:

The bill re-creates the trust fund without modification and clarifies that it is not exempt from the termination provision of Section 19(f), Article III, State Constitution.
