This legislation re-creates the U.S. Contributions Trust Fund without modification, effective November 4, 2004. The U.S. Contributions Trust Fund, FLAIR #52-2-750, is administered by the Department of Community Affairs. This fund was last re-created effective November 4, 2000, by Chapter 2000-32, Laws of Florida.

This fund is used to administer various grants from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) in aid of emergency, prevention, mitigation, preparedness, response, and recovery as provided in s. 252.37, F.S.
