I. Summary:

This legislation re-creates the Special Employment Security Administration Trust Fund without modification, effective November 4, 2004. The Special Employment Security Administration Trust Fund, FLAIR #75-2-648, is administered by the Agency for Workforce Innovation. This fund was last re-created effective November 4, 2000, by Chapter 2000-73, Laws of Florida, in the Department of Labor and Employment Security.

II. Present Situation:

This fund is used to account for penalty and interest payments received from qualified employers that do not pay their unemployment taxes timely, to reimburse the federal government for audit disallowances, to pay administrative expenses, and to function as a revolving fund when necessary to support agency activities.

This bill re-creates the trust fund without modification.
