2	An act relating to motor vehicle insurance for
3	foster children; creating a pilot program for
4	the purpose of reimbursing foster parents for a
5	portion of the increased costs of motor vehicle

15	pilot program; directing the department to

18	report with recommendations to the Governor and
19	the Legislature by a specified date; providing
20	an appropriation; providing an effective date.
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22	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
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24	Section 1. (1) The Legislature finds that foster
25	parents bear the increased cost of motor vehicle insurance for
26	a foster child after that child attains a driver's license.
27	This increase in the cost of insurance creates an additional
28	barrier for a foster child in gaining independence and may
29	limit the child's opportunities for obtaining employment. In
30	accordance with these findings, the Legislature directs the
31	Department of Children and Family Services to establish a
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3-year pilot program in Sarasota, DeSoto, and Manatee 1 2 Counties. 3 (2) To the extent that funding is available, the pilot program shall provide funds to reimburse foster parents for a 4 5 portion of the increase in the cost of motor vehicle б insurance. To be eligible for reimbursement under the pilot program, a foster parent must submit appropriate documentation 7 8 to the department demonstrating the increase in the cost of insurance. The foster parent shall be reimbursed for one-half 9 10 of the amount of the increase in the foster parent's cost of 11 motor vehicle insurance which is incurred as a result of adding the foster child to the policy. The foster child must 12 pay the other half of the increase in insurance costs. If a 13 foster child accumulates six or more points due to one or more 14 moving traffic violations, the child's foster parent is 15 ineligible to receive reimbursement for the increase in 16 insurance costs incurred for that child. The department shall 17 develop procedures for operating the pilot program, including, 18 19 but not limited to, determining eligibility, providing the reimbursement, ensuring that the reimbursement is limited 20 solely to the additional costs of including the foster child 21 in the insurance policy, and allocating available funds. 22 The department shall submit a report to the 23 (3) 24 Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the 25 House of Representatives by December 31, 2005, on the success and outcomes achieved by the pilot program with a 26 27 recommendation as to whether the pilot program should be continued, terminated, or expanded. 28 29 Section 2. The sum of \$50,000 is appropriated from the 30 General Revenue Fund to the Department of Children and Family 31

6	Senate Bill 1058
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8	* Provide that the reimbursement to foster parents for
9	insurance costs will be provided to the extent funding is available.
10 11	* Adds Manatee county to the pilot project.
11	* Amends the term used to identify the motor vehicle insurance for which the reimbursement can be provided to
12	remove "liability" which eliminates the potential that reimbursement could be provided for only the liability
13 14	portion of the insurance.
15	* Requires the Department of Children and Families to develop procedures for the operation of the program.
16	* Requires a report to the Governor and Legislature on the success and outcomes of the pilot program.
17	* Reduces the allocation from \$200,000 to \$50,000.
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
