31	provide a physical examination before the firefighter enters

34	presumption does not apply to benefits payable under or granted
35	in a policy of life insurance or disability insurance, unless
36	the insurer and insured have negotiated for the additional
37	benefits to be included in the policy contract.
38	(2) The governmental entities set forth in subsection (1)
39	may negotiate policy contracts for life and disability insurance
40	which include accidental death benefits or double indemnity
