- Section 1. Subsection 18 is added to section 320.02, Florida Statutes, relating to registration required; application for registration; forms, to state notwithstanding section 320.023, Florida Statutes, the application form for motor vehicle registration and renewal of registration must include language permitting a voluntary contribution of \$2 per applicant to the Florida National Guard Foundation.
- Section 2. Provides an effective date of July 1, 2004.
