This act shall take effect upon becoming a 13 14 law. 15 STATEMENT OF SUBSTANTIAL CHANGES CONTAINED IN COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR 16 17 Senate Bill 1124 18 The committee substitute revises the conditions under which a person is subject to direct supervision by a dermatologist to 19 exclude persons who practice advanced level nursing. The committee substitute defines "dermatological" and 20 "dermatology" for purposes of providing supervision requirements for certain persons providing dermatological care or treatment under a dermatologist's supervision. The 21 22 committee substitute exempts dermatological procedures performed in hospitals, ambulatory surgical centers, and nursing homes from the supervision requirements. 23 24 25 26 27 28 29 30 31 3
