WHEREAS, Florida's water resources are a natural resource and not a commodity to be sold or transferred to the highest bidder, and

WHEREAS, the Florida Senate supports a state "local sources first" policy in state law, and

WHEREAS, the Florida Senate recognizes that the continued retention of the local sources first policy is integral to protecting the state's water resources, advancing long-term sustainable water-resource development and supply systems, and preserving the rights and opportunities of local residents to secure and sustain their future prosperity and quality of life through the use and enjoyment of local water resources, and

WHEREAS, the Florida Senate supports the fundamental principles of the state's water law which require that a proposed use of water be reasonable and beneficial, not interfere with an existing legal use of water, and be consistent with the public interest, and

WHEREAS, the Florida Senate opposes legislation that shifts water-supply allocation from a publicly regulated process to a market-driven process, and

1 WHEREAS, the Florida Senate opposes legislation that 2 undermines a fundamental principle of water law which 3 establishes a right of use rather than a right of ownership, 4 and

WHEREAS, the Florida Senate recently learned that the Florida Council of 100 intends to request a repeal or modification of chapter 373, Florida Statutes, to eliminate provisions that establish a policy for using local water sources first, and

WHEREAS, the Florida Senate wishes to go on record that such a proposal is ill-considered and will put the state's surface waters and aquifers at risk of irreparable harm for irresponsible short-term gain by limited special-interest groups, and

WHEREAS, the Florida Senate believes that any discussion of regional water transfer, before using local sources or alternatives, is premature until minimum flows and levels have been established for all of the state's water resources, NOW, THEREFORE,
