| 3  | (1) A pharmacy may provide pharmacy services to a              |
| 4  | long-term care facility or hospice licensed under chapter 400  |
| 5  | or a state correctional institution operated under chapter 944 |
| 6  | through the use of an automated pharmacy system that need not  |
| 7  | be located at the same location as the pharmacy.               |
| 8  | (2) Medicinal drugs stored in bulk or unit of use in           |
| 9  | an automated pharmacy system servicing a long-term care        |
| 10 | facility, hospice, or correctional institution are part of the |
| 11 | inventory of the pharmacy providing pharmacy services to that  |
| 12 | facility or institution, and drugs dispensed from the          |
