Section 399.1061, Florida Statutes, is created to read: 24 25 399.1061 Elevator Safety Technical Advisory 26 Committee.--27 (1) The Elevator Safety Technical Advisory Committee 28 is created within the Division of Hotels and Restaurants of 29 the Department of Business and Professional Regulation and 30 shall consist of eight members, to be appointed by the Secretary of Business and Professional Regulation as follows: 31

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1 one representative from a major elevator manufacturing company or its authorized representative; one representative from an 2 3 elevator servicing company; one representative from a building design profession; one representative of the general public; 4 5 one representative of a local government in this state; one б representative of a building owner or manager; one 7 representative of labor involved in the installation, 8 maintenance, and repair of elevators; and one representative who is a certified elevator inspector from a private 9 inspection service. The committee shall provide technical 10 11 assistance to the division in support of protecting the health, safety, and welfare of the public and shall give the 12 division the benefit of the committee members' knowledge and 13 experience concerning the industries and individual businesses 14 affected by the laws and rules administered by the division. 15 The committee members shall serve staggered terms 16 (2) 17 of 4 years to be set by rule without salary, but are entitled to reimbursement for per diem and travel expenses as provided 18 19 in s. 112.061. The committee shall appoint one of the members 20 to serve as chair. The committee may consult with engineering 21 (3) authorities and organizations concerned with standard safety 22 codes for recommendations to the department regarding rules 23 governing the operation, maintenance, servicing, construction, 24 25 alteration, installation, or inspection of vertical conveyances subject to this chapter. 26 27 Section 2. Any member of the Elevator Safety Technical 28 Advisory Committee whose term of office was terminated on December 31, 2003, as provided by section 399.106, Florida 29 30 Statutes, but who had held the appointment for less than 4 31 years on that date shall be reappointed for the remainder of

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his or her 4-year term. The Secretary of Business and Professional Regulation shall appoint the other members of the committee to staggered terms of office as provided by section 399.1061, Florida Statutes. Section 399.106, Florida Statutes, is Section 3. б repealed. Section 4. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law. SENATE SUMMARY Reestablishes the Elevator Safety Technical Advisory Committee within the Division of Hotels and Restaurants of the Department of Business and Professional Regulation, which expired on December 31, 2003, by operation of law. Provides for members of the committee whose terms expired on December 31, 2003, but who had not completed a 4-year term, to continue to hold office until completion of a 4-year term.

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
