10	Be It Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

12	That the following amendment to Section 4 of Article VI
13	of the State Constitution is agreed to and shall be submitted
14	to the electors of this state for approval or rejection at the
15	next general election or an earlier special election
16	specifically authorized by law for that purpose:
17	ARTICLE VI
18	SUFFRAGE AND ELECTIONS
19	SECTION 4. Disqualifications
20	(a) No person convicted of a felony <del>, or adjudicated in</del>
21	this or any other state to be mentally incompetent, shall be
22	qualified to vote or hold office until <u>he or she has been</u>
23	released from incarceration and any postconviction supervision
24	restoration of civil rights or removal of disability. <u>No</u>
25	person adjudicated in this or any other state to be mentally
26	incompetent shall be qualified to vote or hold office until
27	removal of disability.
28	(b) No person may appear on the ballot for re-election
29	to any of the following offices:
30	(1) Florida representative,

(3) Florida Lieutenant governor, (4) any office of the Florida cabinet, (5) U.S. Representative from Florida, or (6) U.S. Senator from Florida if, by the end of the current term of office, the person will have served (or, but for resignation, would have served) in that office for eight consecutive years. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the following statement be placed on the ballot: CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT ARTICLE VI, SECTION 4 RIGHT TO VOTE AND HOLD OFFICE .-- Proposing an amendment to the State Constitution to restore a felony offender's right to vote and hold office upon his or her release from incarceration and postconviction supervision.
