28	(3)(a) To be eligible to participate in <del>interscholastic</del>
29	extracurricular student activities, a student must:
30	1. Maintain a grade point average of 2.0 or above on a 4.0

32	cumulative grade point average of 2.0 or above on a 4.0 scale,
33	or its equivalent, in the courses required by s. 1003.43(1).
34	2. Execute and fulfill the requirements of an academic
35	performance contract between the student, the district school

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47 3. Have a cumulative grade point average of 2.0 or above

4. Maintain satisfactory conduct and, if a student is convicted of, or is found to have committed, a felony or a delinquent act which would have been a felony if committed by an adult, regardless of whether adjudication is withheld, the student's participation in interscholastic extracurricular activities is contingent upon established and published district school board policy.

(b) Any student who is exempt from attending a full school day based on rules adopted by the district school board for double session schools or programs, experimental schools, or schools operating under emergency conditions must maintain the grade point average required by this section and pass each class for which he or she is enrolled.

(c) An individual home education student is eligible to 63 64 participate at the public school to which the student would be 65 assigned according to district school board attendance area 66 policies or which the student could choose to attend pursuant to 67 district or interdistrict controlled open enrollment provisions, or may develop an agreement to participate at a private school, 68 69 in the interscholastic extracurricular activities of that 70 school, provided the following conditions are met:

71 1. The home education student must meet the requirements72 of the home education program pursuant to s. 1002.41.

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73 2. During the period of participation at a school, the 74 home education student must demonstrate educational progress as 75 required in paragraph (b) in all subjects taken in the home 76 education program by a method of evaluation agreed upon by the 77 parent and the school principal which may include: review of the 78 student's work by a certified teacher chosen by the parent; 79 grades earned through correspondence; grades earned in courses taken at a community college, university, or trade school; 80 81 standardized test scores above the 35th percentile; or any other method designated in s. 1002.41. 82

3. The home education student must meet the same residency
requirements as other students in the school at which he or she
participates.

4. The home education student must meet the same standards
of acceptance, behavior, and performance as required of other
students in extracurricular activities.

5. The student must register with the school his or her intent to participate in interscholastic extracurricular activities as a representative of the school before the beginning date of the season for the activity in which he or she wishes to participate. A home education student must be able to participate in curricular activities if that is a requirement for an extracurricular activity.

96 6. A student who transfers from a home education program 97 to a public school before or during the first grading period of 98 the school year is academically eligible to participate in 99 interscholastic extracurricular activities during the first

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102 7. Any public school or private school student who has 103 been unable to maintain academic eligibility for participation 104 in interscholastic extracurricular activities is ineligible to 105 participate in such activities as a home education student until 106 the student has successfully completed one grading period in 107 home education pursuant to subparagraph 2. to become eligible to 108 participate as a home education student.

109 (d) An individual charter school student pursuant to s. 110 1002.33 is eligible to participate at the public school to which the student would be assigned according to district school board 111 attendance area policies or which the student could choose to 112 attend, pursuant to district or interdistrict controlled open-113 114 enrollment provisions, in any interscholastic extracurricular 115 activity of that school, unless such activity is provided by the student's charter school, if the following conditions are met: 116

117 1. The charter school student must meet the requirements 118 of the charter school education program as determined by the 119 charter school governing board.

120 2. During the period of participation at a school, the 121 charter school student must demonstrate educational progress as 122 required in paragraph (b).

123 3. The charter school student must meet the same residency 124 requirements as other students in the school at which he or she 125 participates.

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4. The charter school student must meet the same standards
of acceptance, behavior, and performance that are required of
other students in extracurricular activities.

5. The charter school student must register with the school his or her intent to participate in interscholastic extracurricular activities as a representative of the school before the beginning date of the season for the activity in which he or she wishes to participate. A charter school student must be able to participate in curricular activities if that is a requirement for an extracurricular activity.

6. A student who transfers from a charter school program to a traditional public school before or during the first grading period of the school year is academically eligible to participate in interscholastic extracurricular activities during the first grading period if the student has a successful evaluation from the previous school year, pursuant to subparagraph 2.

143 7. Any public school or private school student who has 144 been unable to maintain academic eligibility for participation 145 in interscholastic extracurricular activities is ineligible to 146 participate in such activities as a charter school student until 147 the student has successfully completed one grading period in a 148 charter school pursuant to subparagraph 2. to become eligible to 149 participate as a charter school student.

(4) The student standards for participation in
interscholastic extracurricular activities must be applied
beginning with the student's first semester of the 9th grade.
Each student must meet such other requirements for participation

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154 as may be established by the district school board; however, a 155 district school board may not establish requirements for participation in interscholastic extracurricular activities 156 157 which make participation in such activities less accessible to 158 home education students than to other students. Except as set 159 forth in paragraph (3)(c), evaluation processes or requirements 160 that are placed on home education student participants may not 161 go beyond those that apply under s. 1002.41 to home education 162 students generally.

163 (5) Any organization or entity that regulates or governs
 164 interscholastic extracurricular activities of public schools:

165 (a) Shall permit home education associations to join as166 member schools.

(b) Shall not discriminate against any eligible student
based on an educational choice of public, private, or home
education.

170 (6) Public schools are prohibited from membership in any
 171 organization or entity which regulates or governs
 172 interscholastic extracurricular activities and discriminates
 173 against eligible students in public, private, or home education.

(7) Any insurance provided by district school boards for
participants in extracurricular activities shall cover the
participating home education student. If there is an additional
premium for such coverage, the participating home education
student shall pay the premium.
