Paragraph (b) of subsection (4) of section 15 16 184.046, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 784.046 Action by victim of repeat violence, sexual 17 violence, or dating violence for protective injunction; powers 18 19 and duties of court and clerk of court; filing and form of 20 petition; notice and hearing; temporary injunction; issuance; 21 statewide verification system; enforcement.--22 (4) 23 (b) The sworn petition must be in substantially the following form: 24 25 PETITION FOR INJUNCTION FOR PROTECTION AGAINST REPEAT 26 27 VIOLENCE, SEXUAL VIOLENCE, OR DATING VIOLENCE 28 29 Before me, the undersigned authority, personally 30 appeared Petitioner ... (Name)..., who has been sworn and says 31 that the following statements are true: 1

(address)... 3 (A petitioner for an injunction for protection against sexual 4 5 violence may furnish an address to the court in a separate б confidential filing if, for safety reasons, the petitioner 7 requires the location of his or her current residence to be 8 confidential.) 9 10 2. Petitioner is a victim of dating violence and has 29 reasonable cause to believe that he or she is in imminent 30 danger of becoming the victim of another act of dating 31 violence or has reasonable cause to believe that he or she is 2

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1 in imminent danger of becoming a victim of dating violence, as 2 demonstrated by the fact that the respondent has: ...(list the 3 specific incident or incidents of violence and describe the length of time of the relationship, whether it has been in 4 5 existence during the last 6 months, the nature of the 6 relationship of a romantic or intimate nature, the frequency 7 and type of interaction, and any other facts that characterize 8 the relationship.)... 9 10 11 12 13 14 4. Petitioner genuinely fears repeat violence by the 15 respondent. 5. Petitioner seeks: an immediate injunction against 16 17 the respondent, enjoining him or her from committing any further acts of violence; an injunction enjoining the 18 19 respondent from committing any further acts of violence; and 20 an injunction providing any terms the court deems necessary for the protection of the petitioner and the petitioner's 21 22 immediate family, including any injunctions or directives to law enforcement agencies. 23 Section 2. Section 784.047, Florida Statutes, is 24 25 amended to read: 784.047 Penalties for violating protective injunction 26 against violators. -- A person who willfully violates an 27 28 injunction for protection against repeat violence, sexual 29 violence, or dating violence, issued pursuant to s. 784.046, or a foreign protection order accorded full faith and credit 30 31 pursuant to s. 741.315 by:

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Refusing to vacate the dwelling that the parties 1 (1) 2 share; 3 (2) Going to the petitioner's residence, school, place 4 of employment, or a specified place frequented regularly by 5 the petitioner and any named family or household member; б Committing an act of repeat violence, sexual (3) 7 violence, or dating violence against the petitioner; Committing any other violation of the injunction 8 (4) 9 through an intentional unlawful threat, word, or act to do 10 violence to the petitioner; or 11 (5) Telephoning, contacting, or otherwise communicating with the petitioner directly or indirectly, 12 13 unless the injunction specifically allows indirect contact 14 through a third party; 15 commits a misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable as 16 17 provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083. Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2004. 18 19 20 21 SENATE SUMMARY Allows a petitioner for an injunction for protection against sexual violence to list the address of his or her current residence in a separate confidential filing.
