18	Section 1. Subsections (1) and (2) of section 828.12,
19	Florida Statutes, are amended to read:

21	(1) A person who unnecessarily overloads, overdrives,
22	torments, deprives of necessary sustenance or shelter, or
23	unnecessarily mutilates, or kills any animal, or causes the same

to be done, or carries in or upon any vehicle, or otherwise, any animal in a cruel or inhumane manner, <u>commits</u> is guilty of a misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or by a fine of not more than \$5,000, or both.

(2) A person who intentionally commits an act to any
animal which results in the cruel death, or excessive or
repeated infliction of unnecessary pain or suffering, or causes
the same to be done, <u>commits</u> is guilty of a felony of the third
degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or by a fine of not
more than \$10,000, or both.

34 A person convicted of a violation of this subsection, (a) where the finder of fact determines that the violation includes 35 the knowing and intentional torture or torment of an animal that 36 37 injures, mutilates, or kills the animal, shall be ordered to pay 38 a minimum mandatory fine of \$5,000, shall be sentenced to a minimum mandatory term of incarceration of 6 months, \$2,500 and 39 40 shall undergo psychological counseling or complete an anger 41 management treatment program.

42 Any person convicted of a second or subsequent (b) violation of this subsection shall be required to pay a minimum 43 mandatory fine of \$5,000 and shall be sentenced to a minimum 44 45 mandatory term of incarceration of 10 months and serve a minimum 46 mandatory period of incarceration of 6 months. In addition, the 47 person shall be released only upon expiration of sentence, shall 48 not be eligible for parole, control release, or any form of 49 early release, and must serve 100 percent of the court-imposed sentence. Any plea of nolo contendere shall be considered a 50 51 conviction for purposes of this subsection.
