31-264-04 A bill to be entitled 1 2 An act relating to school personnel; requiring the Department of Education to limit the number 3 4 of noninstructional personnel that may be 5 employed by school districts; defining the term "noninstructional personnel"; requiring that 6 7 the department classify school districts based on the number of full-time-equivalent students 8 9 enrolled in the district; requiring that the 10 department establish ratios within each district classification for the maximum 11 12 percentage of noninstructional personnel to full-time-equivalent students; limiting the 13 maximum ratios that the department may 14 establish; requiring a reduction in state funds 15 for any school district that exceeds the 16 17 maximum percentage of noninstructional personnel; providing an effective date. 18 19 20 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 21 22 Section 1. Limitation on employment of 23 noninstructional personnel by school districts .--24 (1)(a) Notwithstanding any other law, the Department 25 of Education shall establish limitations on the number of noninstructional personnel that may be employed by school 26 27 districts, based on the total number of full-time-equivalent 28 students enrolled in the district. (b) As used in this section, the term 29 30 "noninstructional personnel" means school district personnel 31 who:

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1 1. Are classified as administrative personnel or managers under section 1012.01, Florida Statutes; and 2 3 2. Do not perform any instructional duties. (2)(a) Based on the prior year's enrollment, the 4 5 department shall classify the school districts as follows: б the 20 districts with the fewest number of 7 full-time-equivalent students shall be classified as 8 small-sized districts; the 10 districts with the largest number of full-time-equivalent students shall be classified as 9 large-sized districts; and the remaining districts shall be 10 11 classified as medium-sized districts. (b) By July 1 of each year, the department shall 12 establish a ratio for the school districts in each of the 13 three size classifications. The ratio must specify the maximum 14 percentage of noninstructional personnel to 15 full-time-equivalent students which a school district may 16 17 employ. However, the department shall provide for an adjustment in the ratio for a district that contains a larger 18 19 percentage of small schools than districts of equivalent size. The department may not establish a ratio that exceeds the 20 21 average ratio of noninstructional personnel to full-time-equivalent students which existed within a 22 particular district size classification during the 2002-2003 23 24 school year. 25 (c) In addition, the department shall determine the average annual salary, including the cost of benefits, for 26 27 noninstructional personnel employed by school districts in 28 each of the three size classifications. 29 The department shall determine each school year if (3) 30 any school district exceeds the maximum number of positions allowed for noninstructional personnel. For each position that 31 2

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exceeds the maximum allowable number within a district, the department shall deduct an amount equal to 50 percent of the average cost of that position from the state funds allocated to the district. Section 2. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law. SENATE SUMMARY Requires that the Department of Education establish limits on the percentage of noninstructional personnel relative to student population which may be employed by relative to student population which may be employed by school districts. Requires that the department divide the school districts into three categories based on the number of full-time-equivalent students enrolled in the district. Provides for the ratios set by the department to be based on the size classification of the district. Requires that the department deduct from state funds allocated to the district 50 percent of the average cost of each position that exceeds the maximum number allowed for noninstructional personnel.
