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26	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
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28	Section 1. Subsection (7) of section 372.57, Florida
29	Statutes, is amended, and subsections (16) and (17) are added
30	to that section, to read:
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1 372.57 Recreational licenses, permits, and 2 authorization numbers; fees established .--3 (7) SALTWATER VESSEL LICENSES.--4 (a) No person may operate any vessel wherein a fee is 5 paid, either directly or indirectly, for the purpose of б taking, attempting to take, or possessing any saltwater fish 7 for noncommercial purposes unless she or he has obtained a license for each vessel for that purpose, and has paid the 8 license fee pursuant to paragraph (b), paragraph (c), or 9 10 paragraph (d)paragraphs (b) and (c) for such vessel. 11 (b) A license for any person who operates any vessel licensed to carry more than 10 customers, wherein a fee is 12 13 paid, either directly or indirectly, for the purpose of taking or attempting to take saltwater fish, is \$800 per year. The 14 license must be kept aboard the vessel at all times. 15 (c) A license for any person who operates any vessel 16 17 licensed to carry no more than 10 customers, or for any person 18 licensed to operate any vessel carrying 6 or fewer customers, 19 wherein a fee is paid, either directly or indirectly, for the 20 purpose of taking or attempting to take saltwater fish, is 21 \$400 per year. 22 $(d)_{2}$. A license for any person licensed to operate any vessel carrying 6 or fewer customers but who operates a vessel 23 24 carrying 4 or fewer customers, wherein a fee is paid, either 25 directly or indirectly, for the purpose of taking or attempting to take saltwater fish, is \$200 per year. The 26 27 license must be kept aboard the vessel at all times. 28 (e) A person who operates a vessel required to be 29 licensed pursuant to paragraph (b), paragraph (c), or this paragraph(d)may obtain a license in her or his own name, and 30 31 such license shall be transferable and apply to any vessel 2

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1 operated by the purchaser, provided that the purchaser has 2 paid the appropriate license fee. 3 (f)(d) A license for a recreational vessel not for hire and for which no fee is paid, either directly or 4 5 indirectly, by guests for the purpose of taking or attempting б to take saltwater fish noncommercially is \$2,000 per year. 7 The license may be purchased at the option of the vessel owner and must be kept aboard the vessel at all times. A log of 8 9 species taken and the date the species were taken shall be 10 maintained and a copy of the log filed with the commission at 11 the time of renewal of the license. (g)(e) The owner, operator, or custodian of a vessel 12 13 the operator of which has been licensed pursuant to paragraph 14 (a) must maintain and report such statistical data as required 15 by, and in a manner set forth in, the rules of the commission. (16) FRESHWATER VESSEL LICENSE PILOT PROGRAM.--16 17 (a) The Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission shall establish a 1-year nonmandatory freshwater vessel 18 19 license program which shall be implemented July 1, 2004. 20 Freshwater vessel licenses issued under this subsection will expire on June 30, 2005, and are nonrenewable. Except as 21 provided in paragraph (e), any license issued under this pilot 22 program must be identified as a freshwater vessel license and 23 24 may not be transferred for use to other fishing vessels during 25 the time for which the license is valid. The owner, operator, or custodian of a vessel licensed pursuant to this subsection 26 27 must maintain and report such statistical data as required by the commission. 28 29 (b) A license for any vessel for hire as certified by the United States Coast Guard to carry 11 or more passengers, 30 31 wherein a fee is paid either directly or indirectly for the

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1 purpose of taking or attempting to take freshwater fish, is \$800 per year. The license must be kept aboard the vessel at 2 3 all times. (c) A license for any vessel for hire as certified by 4 5 the United States Coast Guard to carry 10 or fewer passengers б is \$400 per year, or for any vessel for hire carrying 6 or fewer passengers, wherein a fee is paid either directly or 7 8 indirectly for the purpose of taking or attempting to take freshwater fish, is \$400 per year. The license must be kept 9 10 aboard the vessel at all times. 11 (d) A license for any vessel for hire carrying 6 or fewer passengers but that carries 4 or fewer passengers, 12 wherein a fee is paid either directly or indirectly for the 13 purpose of taking or attempting to take freshwater fish, is 14 \$200 per year. The license must be kept aboard the vessel at 15 16 all times. 17 (e) A person who must be licensed by the United States Coast Guard to operate a vessel licensed under paragraph (b), 18 19 paragraph (c), or paragraph (d) may obtain a license in her or his own name, and such shall be transferable and apply to any 20 vessel operated by the purchaser, provided that the purchaser 21 has paid the appropriate fee. 22 (f) Funds resulting from the sale of freshwater vessel 23 24 licenses authorized in this subsection shall be deposited into the State Game Trust Fund within the Fish and Wildlife 25 Conservation Commission. 26 27 This subsection expires July 1, 2005. (q) 28 (17) VESSEL LICENSE TASK FORCE.--29 The Vessel License Task Force is created within (a) 30 the Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission for the purpose 31

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1 of reviewing the commission's vessel license programs to 2 determine: 3 1. If vessel licenses for saltwater and freshwater vessels should be mandatory or permissive licenses; 4 5 2. If the vessel license programs should be repealed; б If fees generated from the sale of vessel licenses 3. 7 are sufficient to offset the loss of revenue to the commission 8 which is generated by persons who are not required to purchase 9 an individual license because they are paying to fish from a 10 licensed vessel; 11 4. A fair and equitable fee for saltwater and freshwater vessel licenses if the task force recommends that 12 the vessel license programs should not be repealed and further 13 finds that revenues from the sale of vessel licenses are not 14 adequate to cover the loss of revenue to the commission which 15 is generated by the reduction in the sale of individual 16 17 fishing licenses; and 5. A method of tracking the number of persons who pay 18 19 to fish from licensed vessels so that the commission can better determine the user impact on saltwater and freshwater 20 resources. 21 The Vessel License Task Force shall be comprised 22 (b) of seven members and must include one member of the Florida 23 Guides Association, two freshwater fishing guides licensed by 24 the United States Coast Guard, one member working as a 25 part-time freshwater fishing guide, one saltwater fishing 26 27 guide licensed by the United States Coast Guard, one member working as a part-time saltwater fishing guide, and one 28 29 representative from the Fish and Wildlife Conservation 30 Commission with knowledge of the commission's vessel license programs, who is selected by the executive director but who 31 5

1 must not be a commissioner and who will serve as chair of the task force. Members of the task force shall be selected by the 2 3 chair and must serve without compensation. 4 (C) The task force shall meet at the call of the 5 chair, or at the request of a majority of its members. Staff б of the commission shall serve as staff of the task force. 7 (d) By February 1, 2006, the task force shall submit 8 written recommendations to the Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission. Copies of the written recommendations must also be 9 10 submitted to the staff of the natural resources committees and 11 appropriations committees of the Senate and the House of 12 Representatives. 13 (e) This subsection expires July 1, 2006. 14 Section 2. Section 4. Except as otherwise expressly provided in б this act, this act shall take effect upon becoming a law. STATEMENT OF SUBSTANTIAL CHANGES CONTAINED IN COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR Senate Bill 1714 The committee substitute requires that the Fish & Wildlife Conservation Commission create a 1-year nonmandatory freshwater vessel license program to be implemented by July 1, 2004. The vessel license will be available to persons operating a vessel that is hired for the purpose of recreationally taking freshwater fish. The committee substitute clarifies that the fees and categories for freshwater vessel licenses are the same as the fees and categories for the mandatory vessel license program currently established for recreational saltwater fishing. The committee substitute establishes a Vessel License Task Force within the FWCC for the purpose of reviewing the commission's vessel license program. Goals of the task force include determining if vessel license revenues will generate as much revenue as might be gained if individual saltwater and freshwater licenses were sold to persons fishing from licensed vessels. The committee substitute clarifies that the FWCC task force representative is appointed by the executive director of the The committee substitute requires that the Fish & Wildlife The committee substitute clarifies that the FWCC task force representative is appointed by the executive director of the FWCC, and may not be a FWCC commissioner. The FWCC representative will serve as chair of the task force and is responsible for appointing other task force members. Task force recommendations must be submitted in writing to the FWCC and to the appropriate committees of the Legislature no later than February 1, 2006. The committee substitute creates an exemption from individual fishing license requirements for persons fishing from a licensed freshwater vessel, and clarifies that upon the expiration of the pilot program. the clarifies that upon the expiration of the pilot program, the individual license exemption also expires.
