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20	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
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22	Section 1. Subsection (10) of section 430.203, Florida
23	Statutes, is amended to read:
24	430.203 Community care for the elderly;
25	definitionsAs used in ss. 430.201-430.207, the term:
26	(10) "Multiservice senior center" means a <u>community</u>
27	facility for the organization and provision of a broad
28	spectrum of that serves as the focal point for housing and
29	delivering services, which shall include provision of health,
30	including mental health, social, nutritional, and education
31	services, and the provision of facilities for recreational
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activities for to persons 60 years of age or older. A 1 multiservice senior center may also be a facility as 2 3 designated by the department in its master plan prepared pursuant to s. 430.04(3). 4 5 Section 2. Subsection (3) is added to section 430.206, б Florida Statutes, to read: 7 430.206 Multiservice senior center.--8 (3)(a) Effective July 1, 2005, each multiservice 9 senior center is encouraged to have on the premises at all 10 times a functioning automated external defibrillator. 11 (b) Multiservice senior centers that provide automated external defibrillators shall ensure that personnel are 12 properly trained in accordance with s. 401.2915. 13 (c) The location of each automated defibrillator shall 14 be registered with the appropriate county office by the 15 multiservice senior center pursuant to s. 401.2915. 16 The use of automated external defibrillators by 17 (d) 18 employees and volunteers shall be covered under the provisions 19 of ss. 768.13 and 768.1325. The department may adopt rules to implement the 20 (e) provisions of this section. 21 Section 3. There is hereby appropriated to the 22 Department of Elderly Affairs a sum of \$270,000 to implement 23 24 the provisions of this act. The department shall arrange for 25 the purchase of as many automated external defibrillators as may be purchased with available funds. Senior centers shall 26 27 reimburse the department for 50 percent of the cost of the automated external defibrillator provided to their facility. 28 29 Multiservice senior centers located in rural communities, as 30 defined in sections 288.0656(2)(b) and 288.06561, Florida 31 Statutes, shall not be required to reimburse the department

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for the costs of such equipment. The department shall authorize issuance of the equipment to senior centers in the order in which they request one and shall provide authorization for only one to each multiservice center pursuant to this section. б Section 4. Except as otherwise provided herein, this act shall take effect upon becoming a law. 

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
