Subsection (3) is added to section 430.206, Florida Statutes, to read: 4 5 430.206 Multiservice senior center.-б (3)(a) Each multiservice senior center is encouraged 7 to have on the premises at all times a functioning automated 8 external defibrillator. 9 (b) Multiservice senior centers that provide automated 10 external defibrillators shall ensure that personnel are 11 properly trained in accordance with s. 401.2915. (c) The location of each automated external 12 defibrillator shall be registered with a local emergency 13 medical services medical director. 14 (d) The use of automated external defibrillators by 15 employees and volunteers shall be covered under the provisions 16 17 of ss. 768.13 and 768.1325. The department may adopt rules to implement the 18 (e) 19 provisions of this section. Section 3. The sum of \$240,000 is appropriated from 20 the General Revenue Fund to the Department of Elderly Affairs 21 for the purpose of implementing this act during the 2004-2005 22 fiscal year. The department shall arrange for the purchase of 23 as many automated external defibrillators as may be purchased 24 with available funds. Senior centers shall reimburse the 25 department for 50 percent of the cost of the automated 26 27 external defibrillator provided to their facility. Multiservice senior centers located in rural communities, as 28 29 defined in section 288.0656(2)(b), Florida Statutes, shall not be required to reimburse the department for the costs of such 30 equipment. The department shall authorize issuance of the 31

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equipment to senior centers in the order in which they request one and shall provide authorization for only one to each multiservice center pursuant to this section. Section 4. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law. б STATEMENT OF SUBSTANTIAL CHANGES CONTAINED IN COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR CS for CS for SB 1748 Reduces the appropriation from $\$270\,,000$ to $\$240\,,000$ from the General Revenue Fund to the Department of Elder Affairs.

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
